At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the tenth day of June A. D.

1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of

sundry inhabitants of the Township of Karthaun in said county, ~~setting forth~~ that asking that

Viewers be appointed to Vacate and Supply that part of the public road passing through the land of R. B. Bridgins and leading from a point on the line of John Reiter Dec<sup>r</sup>. to a point on the Public Road leading to Salt Lick and on a line of between lands of R. B. Bridgins and ~~John~~ Reiter Dec<sup>r</sup>.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make Report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Charles Schiaro J. H. Michel & J. Rankin who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.

## RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.



To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of

The Petition of R.C. Bridgeman respectfully  
 asking the above Court to appoint viewers to  
 remove the Public Road passing through his  
 Land in Hartman's Twp and Locate said Road  
 on the line between the said R.C. Bridgeman and  
 the Land of John Reiter (Deceased) the Road as  
 now laid out cuts up the said R.C. Bridgeman's  
 Land so that it is very inconvenient to fence,  
 as said Road starts at the line of John
