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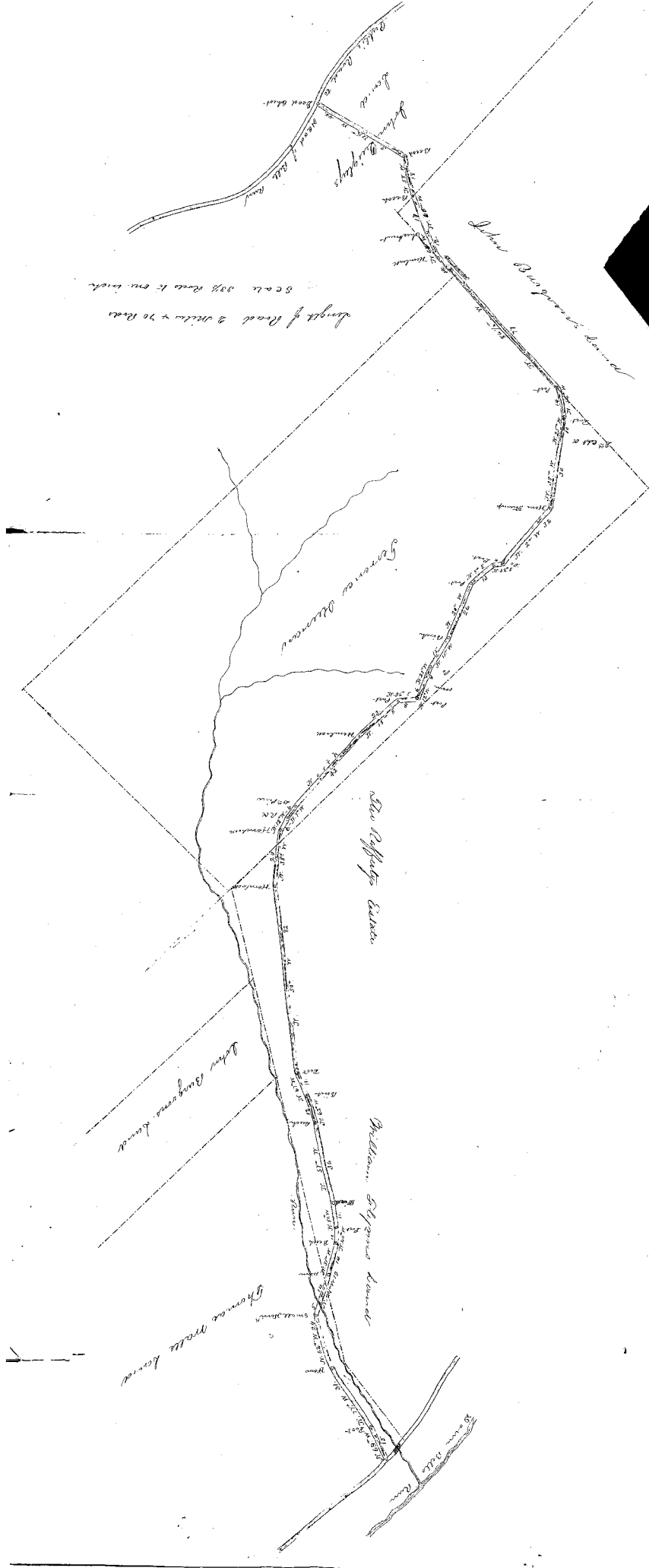
To the Honorable Judges within named
Or the undersigned viewers appointed
by the foregoing order of Court to view the
Road therein described. We Report
that in pursuance of said appointment
and order of Court after first having given
due notice by advertisements put up according
to Law of the time and place of meeting we
all met and being duly sworn & affirmed
we did proceed to view the ground & said
proposed road, and which after having
viewed the same we are of the opinion that
said road is necessary ^{for public use}, and have viewed
and laid out the same by the following
Courses & distances beginning near the South
End of a Bridge on the road leading from
Eliz Walls Sawmill to Mr. Filym. at a Post-
then up on the South side of a Run & through
Land of Eliz Wall North Sixty nine Degrees west
Fifteen perches. Then North Seventy seven degrees

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Eighth day of October A. D. 1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Penn in said county, ~~setting forth that asking Viewers~~

to be appointed to view and lay out a road to lead from public road near Tugleys to a Bridge on public road between Hall's and W. Flynn's.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint James McKinnon Patrick Daley and Thos. W. Moore who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained; and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.
