To the Honorable Judges within named
Are the undersigned viewers appointed
by the foregoing order of Court to view the
Road therein described. Do Report
that in Pursuance of said Appointment
and Order of Court after first having given
due Notice by advertisements put up according
to Law of the time and place of meeting we
all met and being duly sworn & affirmed
we did proceed to view the ground for said
proposed road, and which after having
viewed the same we are of the opinion that
Said road is necessary, and have viewed
and laid out the same by the following
Courses & distances beginning near the South
End of a Bridge on the road leading from
Dove Walls Sawmill to G^rm Filkins. at a Post
thence up on the South side of a Run & through
land of Dove Wall North Sixty nine degrees west
fifteen perches. thence North Seventy seven degrees
west thirty one perches to a Hemlock. thence
North Sixty two degrees West. Twenty four
perches to a small Hemlock, thence North Twenty
four degrees West at five & one half perches cross
Run. and nineteen perches to a Hemlock thence
North Thirty one degrees West fourteen perches
to a Beech. thence North Forty degrees West ten
perches to a Post. thence North fifty one degrees west


Eleven Perches to a Birch. North Fifty seven degrees West, Thirty six Perches to a Beech. Then North Sixty two degrees West. Twelve Perches to a Birch North Sixty seven deg West Eleven perches, to a Post North Fifty degrees West Eighty two Perches to a Hemlock. North thirty eight degrees West Twenty four perches to a Hemlock, North twelve degrees West Six perches to Red R. North Seven degrees West Six Perches to a Pine. North Forty two Perches to a Hem^c, North Fifteen degrees East. Twenty three perches to Post. Then North thirty six deg. East-Eights-Per^c, North twelve degrees West Six per^c to Hem. North twenty seven deg west nine perches North Eleven degrees west fifteen Per to a Birch. North twenty deg West Twenty six per^c. North Seven degrees East. Thirteen Perches North thirty two deg East Four perches. North Two degrees West Thirty two per^c to New Stump. North thirty eight deg West Thirty per^c to a Chest, R. Then North Twenty five deg West Ten perches North 56 deg West. 14. Perches to line of T Keenan & John Burgoon & by said line or 86 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg West 77 Perches to a Hem then North 68 deg West 12 perches to Chest. Then North 65 degrees West 17 Perches to line of John Quigley. Then North 58 degrees West Eighteen Perches to a Beech. Then South 77 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West Forty four Perches to a New Chest on Public road on line of John Quigley a Plot or Draft of which we herewith annex

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county
of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county,
on the Eighth day of October A. D.

1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of
sundry inhabitants of the Township of Penn

in said county, setting forth that asking Leavers

to be appointed to view and lay out a road to
lead from public road near Duglins to a Branch
on public road between Stalls and W. Flynn's

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out
the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and
appoint James McRae Patrick Daley and Tho. H. Moore
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their ap-
pointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for
said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that
there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable
to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for
a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to pri-
vate property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the
courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it
passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose
lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the
same, if any sustained; and shall make report thereof to the next Court of
Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state
that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to
be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within
road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of
Court.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
