Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the
20 day of March, A. D. 1884

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-
itants of the township of Sandy, in

said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a public road
to begin at a point in public road near John
Brooks to Rail Road of Low Grade Division
from thence to lands of Lew Shaffer on a public
on a public road about one & three quarter miles
being in Sandy Township, Clearfield Co Pa

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same
according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

R. V. Spackman Geo. C. Kirk R. H. Moore viewers
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

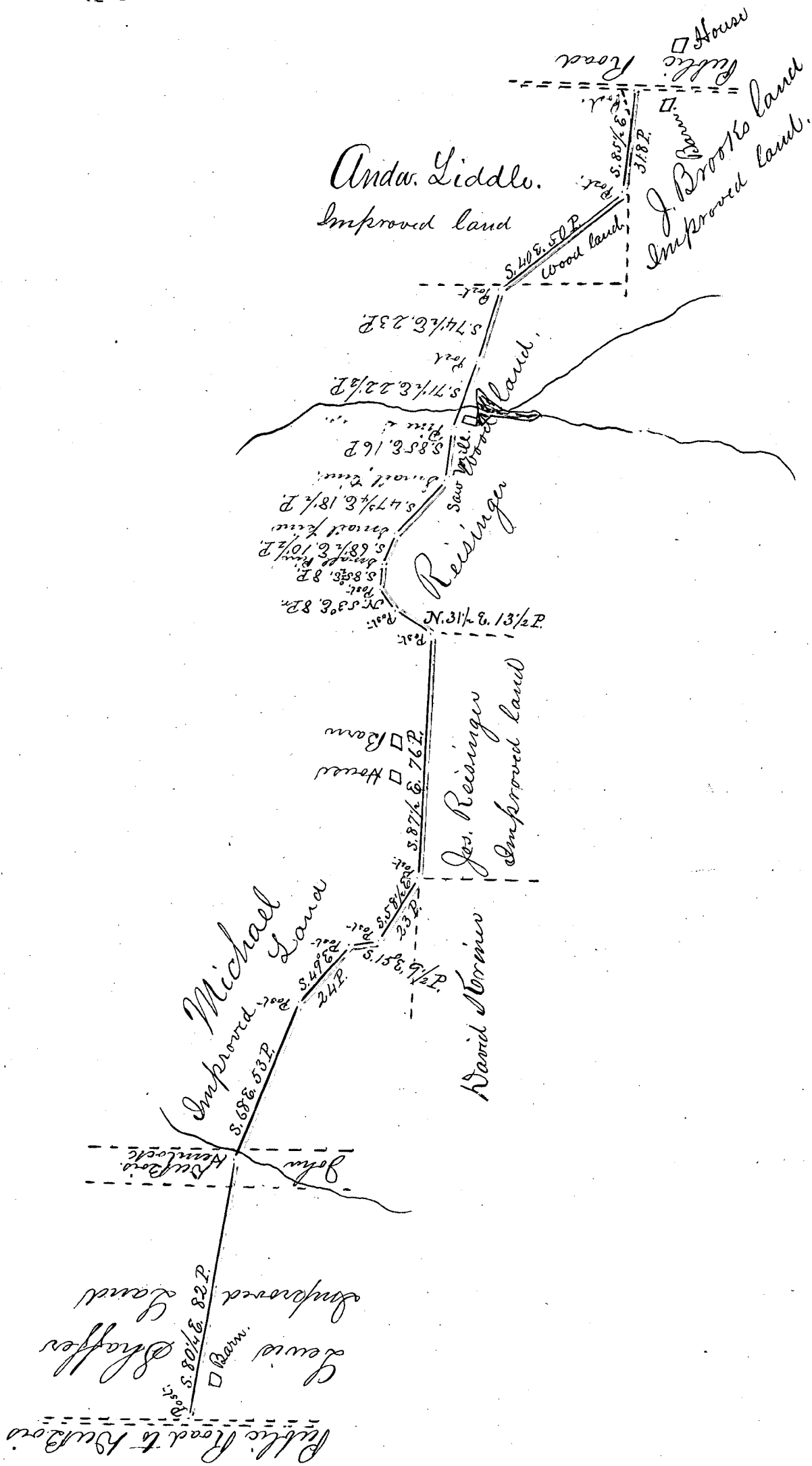
ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

To the Honorable, the Judges within named: We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order do report; That in pursuance thereof, after having been duly sworn according to law, viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion, do the least damage to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit: Beginning at a post at public road on land of Lewis Shaffer, in Sandy twp. Clearfield Co., Pa., Thence S. 80 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. partly on land of said Shaffer and partly on land of John DuBois, eighty two perches to a hemlock; Thence S. 68° E. partly on land of said DuBois, and partly on land of M. Reisinger, fifty three perches to a post; Thence S. 49° E. twenty four perches to a post; Thence S. 15° E. Nine and a half perches to a post; Thence S. 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. twenty three perches to a post on line between Michael and J^d Reisinger, thence by the same S. 87 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. seventy six perches to a post; Thence N. 31 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., on land of said M. Reisinger, thirteen and a half perches to a post; Thence N. 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. Eight perches to post; Thence S. 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. Eight perches to a small pine; Thence S. 68 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. ten and a half perches to a small pine; Thence S. 47 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E. eighteen and a half perches to a small pine; Thence S. 85° E. sixteen perches to a pine stump; Thence S. 71 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. twenty two and a half perches to post; Thence S. 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. twenty three perches to post; Thence partly on land of said Reisinger, and partly on land of Andrew Liddle, ^{S. 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W.} fifty perches to a post; Thence partly by land of said Liddle and partly by ~~DuBois~~ land, S. 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. thirty one and $\frac{8}{10}$ perches to post in public road near John Broth's, leading to R. R. on Low Grade Division. We further report, that before said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity: ten days before said meeting, and that there are no damages resulting to any but of the owners of the land over which said road passes by reason of opening the same. We annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same pass.

 Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
