To the Honorable Judges within named.

We the undersigned vicims, appointed by the within Order of Court to view, and lay out the Road therein mentioned, Respectfully report,

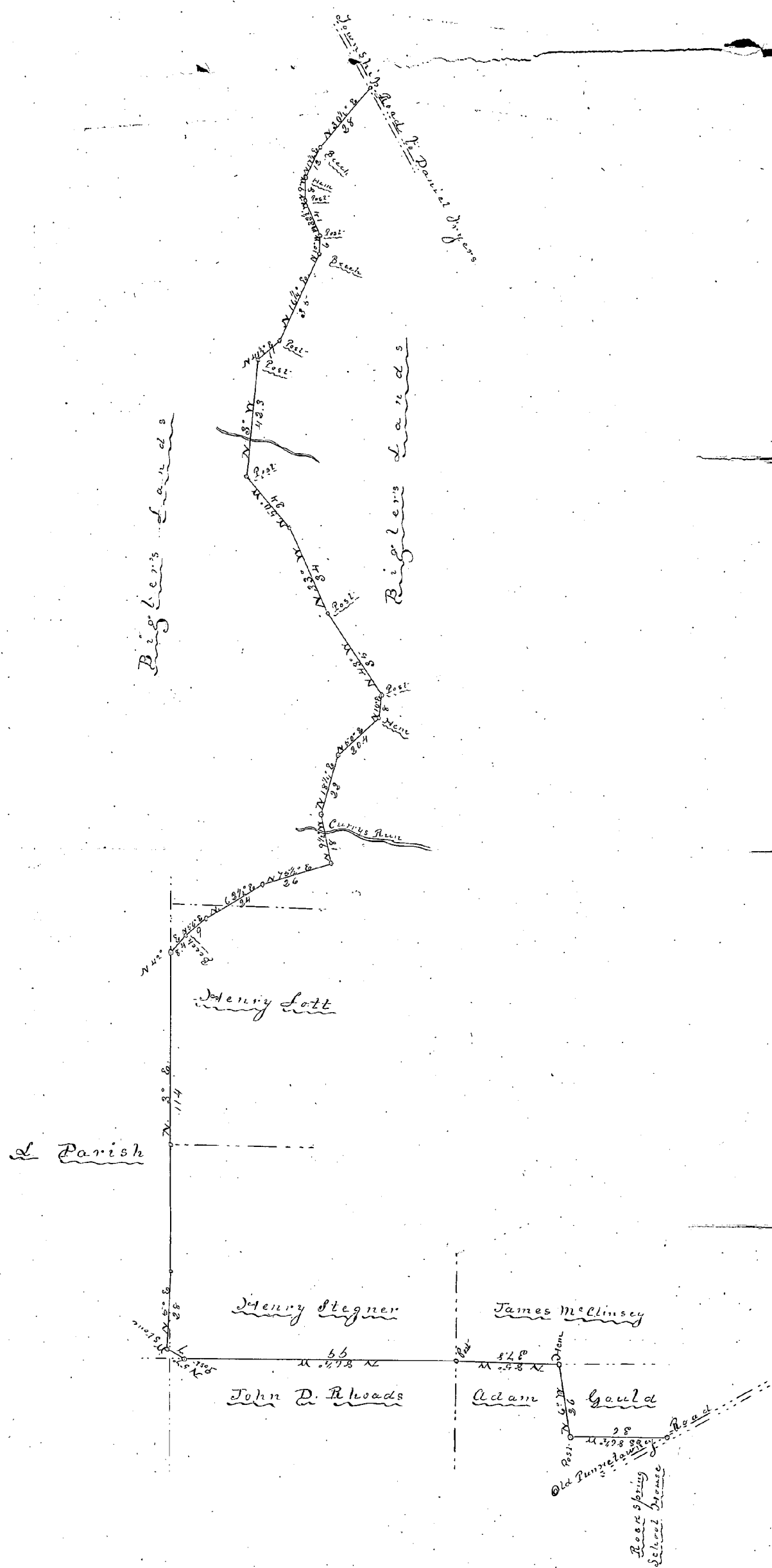
That having given notice of the time and place of meeting according to the act of assembly, and being all present, at the view of the ground proposed for the said road, and being all sworn or affirmed in firmance of the said Order. We have viewed, and laid out, and do return the following viz: Beginning at a Post by Marks, in the old Foxetauney Road, near "Rock Spring" School House, and running through land of Adam Gould South Eighty six and a half degrees West. Thirty six perches to a Post; North six degrees West, twenty six perches to a Hemlock. North Eighty five degrees West. Thirty seven and Eight tenths perches to a Post. Thence along the line Between John D Rhoads, and Henry Stegner, North Eighty six and a half degrees West. Ninety nine perches, to a Post; Thence through land of Stegner North Fifty seven degrees West, Seven perches to a Stone. Thence Throgh land of S Parish North five degrees East. Twenty Eight perches, Thence along the line Between Parish and Stegner and Henry Lott North Three degrees East. One hundred and fourteen perches to a Post on line of Parish. Thence through land of H Lott, North Forty two degrees East. Eight and four tenths perches, to a Beech. North fifty six degrees East. Nine perches. North Sixty two and a half degrees East. Twenty four perches, North Seventy five and

half degrees East twenty six perches. Thence through land
of Biglers North nine and a half degrees west. Eighteen
perches to a Post. North Eighteen and a quarter degrees East.
twenty two perches. North fifty degrees East; twenty and four
tenths perches to a Hemlock. North Ten degrees East.
Eight perches to a Post. North Forty three degrees west. thirty
five perches, to a Post. North Thirty three degrees west. thirty
four perches. North fifty degrees west. twenty four perches
to a Post. North three degrees west. Forty two and three
tenths perches to a Post. North forty one and a half degrees East.
Eleven perches. North sixteen and a quarter degrees East.
Thirty five perches, to a Birch. North Ten degrees west; Six per-
ches. North Thirty two and a half degrees west. Fourteen perches
North nine degrees west; Eight perches to a Hemlock. North
Seventeen and a half degrees East; Twelve perches, to a Birch
North Thirty and a half degrees East. Twenty eight perches to the
Township Road leading to Daniel Rogers.

Which said Road as aforesaid laid out, we are of opinion is
necessary for public use. A Plot, or Draft whereof is herewith an-
nexed - No damage claimed, and we are of opinion that no
one is entitled to any.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 2nd day of June A. D.

1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Bell

in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a Public road to lead from the Old Susquehanna Road at a point near the Rock Spring School House to intersect a Public Road at or near Geo. & Daniel Myers on road leading to Troutville

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, & make report to Court

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. J. McCloskey John Irwin and John Pultz who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 14th rule of Court.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
