To the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions in the within or annexed order.

We the persons appointed by the said Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned, do report that having first given Notice according to law of the time and place of the view and having been duly sworn and affirmed in the manner and forms prescribed by the said order did view the ground for the proposed road and have laid out and now return the same for a public road. —

Beginning at a point on Front Street near the Methodist Church in the borough of Glen Hope Thence through improved lands of E. A. White John Massgo and J. M. Wright North thirty four ( $34^{\circ}$ ) degrees West Thirty seven perches and three links to post. —

Thence through unimproved land of C. L. Spunhoffer and D. Bear South fifty six and one half ( $56\frac{1}{2}$ ) degrees West, Eleven and one half perches to end of Pine Street. And for the reason of certain improvements interfering do recommend that the width of the road for the first course and distance (viz. N.  $34^{\circ}$  W.  $37\frac{1}{2}$  perches) be fixed at Twenty feet as a greater width on this part of the road would be very injurious to private property. And have assessed damages as appear on opposite page so far as we believe the persons are entitled to through whose land the road is laid out.

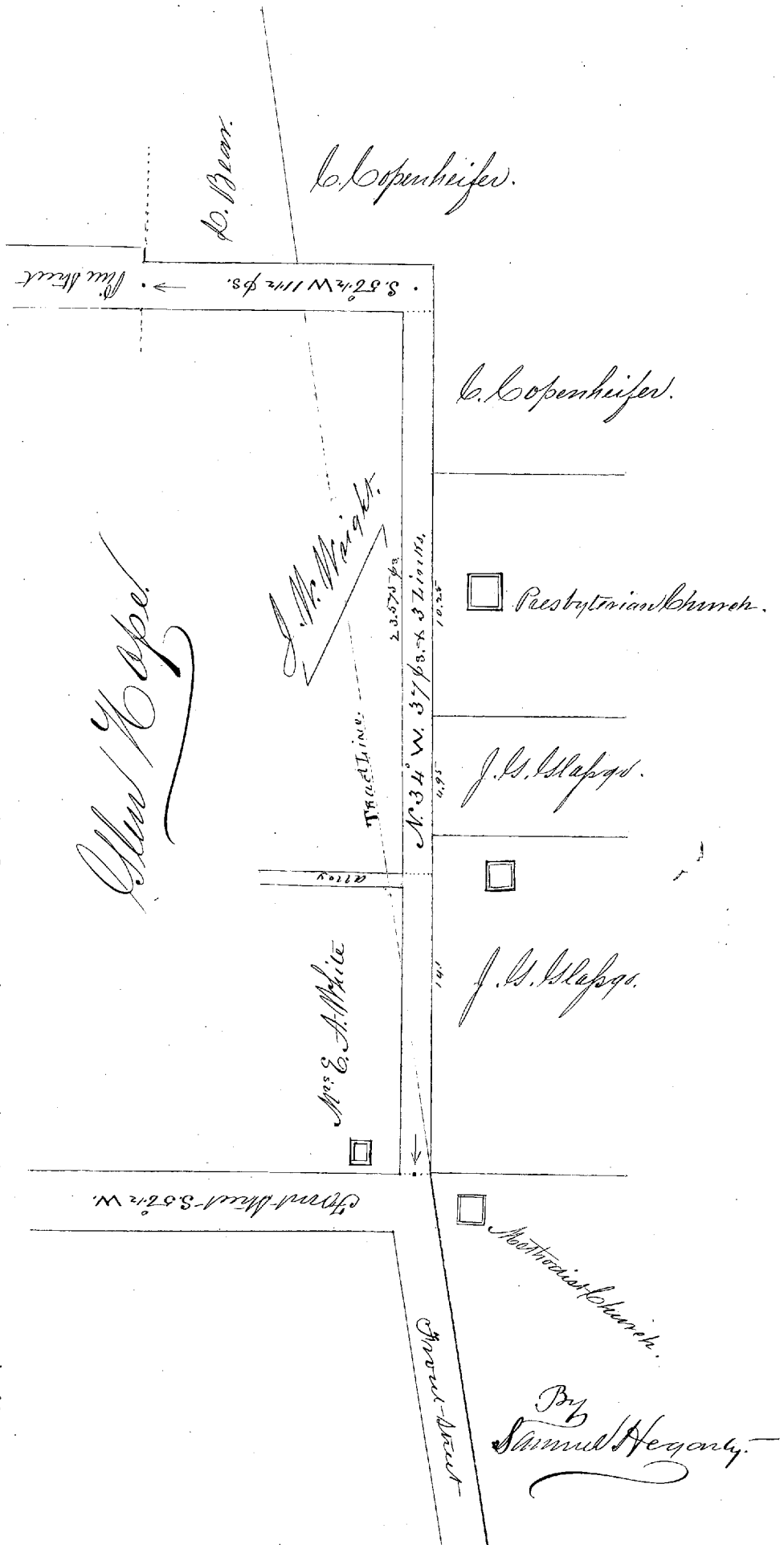

## RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

NOTE.—In case of a Private Road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.  
Also— Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

**Clearfield County, ss:**

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county  
of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county,  
on the First day of Oct A. D.

1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of  
sundry inhabitants of the ~~Township~~ <sup>Borough</sup> of Elmhurst  
in said county, setting forth that they labor

under great inconvenience for want of a  
Public Road or Highway or Street to lead  
from a point on Front Street near the Methodist  
Church to intersect Pine Street at a point  
near the Presbyterian Church in said  
Borough of Elmhurst

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out  
the same according to law, and make Report to the Court  
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and  
appoint Samuel Hagerly Henry Dolt & M. Luther  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their ap-  
pointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for  
said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that  
there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable  
to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for  
a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to pri-  
vate property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary  
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the  
courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it  
passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose  
lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the  
same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of  
Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state  
that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to  
be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within  
road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 14th rule of  
Court.
