
To the Hon. the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in the within or annexed or elsewhere named.

We the persons appointed by the said Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned do report that having first given all notice according to law of the day and place of meeting and having been severally affirmed in the manner and form prescribed by the said order that all of us having viewed the ground for the proposed road did lay out and now return the same for a public road. Beginning at a point on a public road leading to Mathews School, Thence North 25 degrees East, forty-four perches post. Thence North 63 degrees East, fifteen perches, small white Birch. Thence North 37 degrees East, eighteen perches post. Thence North 62 degrees East, twenty-six perches, small sapling. Thence North 68<sup>deg</sup> East, twenty perches. Birch. Thence North 56<sup>1/2</sup> degrees East, thirty-two perches. Hemlock. Thence N 81<sup>1/2</sup> degrees East, twenty-one perches. Birch. Thence North 65<sup>1/2</sup> degrees East, twenty-three perches. Small Beech. Thence North 77 degrees East, fifteen perches. Elmwood. Thence South 84 degrees East, twenty perches post. Thence South 50 degrees East, thirteen perches. Lime, thence South 39<sup>1/2</sup> degrees East, twenty-three perches, dead pine stub. Thence South 57 degrees East, fifteen perches small Hickory. Thence South 57<sup>1/2</sup> degrees East, twenty-eight perches post. Thence South 76 degrees East, eighteen perches, dead Hemlock. Thence North 85<sup>1/2</sup> degrees East, twelve perches small Hickory. Thence North 80 degrees East, twelve perches post. Thence South 84 degrees East, forty-eight perches post. Thence North 33 degrees East, twenty-two perches post. Thence through improvement of George Hammons South 80 degrees East, forty-six perches to Clearfield Creek. Thence across said Creek, about one hundred feet. Thence South 79 degrees East, thirty-six perches a point

on public road near to and leading into Coal Port

**Clearfield County, Pa.**

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21 day of January A. D. 1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Becaria in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from Mathers School House to Coal Port in said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Samuel Hagerly Thomas Fleck ~~and~~ Weld who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
