Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county
of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county,
on the *Fifth* day of *Oct* A. D.

1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of
sundry inhabitants of the Township of *Woodward*
in said county, setting forth that *they labor*
under great inconvenience for want of
a Public road to lead from Roth
fording to Joys fording in said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out
the same according to law, *and make report to the Court*
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and
appoint *J. L. Leuttle John D. Patterson Geo D. Wm. Wm.*
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their ap-
pointment with impartiality and fidelity; are to view the grounds proposed for
said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that
there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable
to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for
a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to pri-
vate property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the
courses and distances and referencē to the improvements through which it
passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose
lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the
same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of
Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state
that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to
be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within
road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of
Court.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

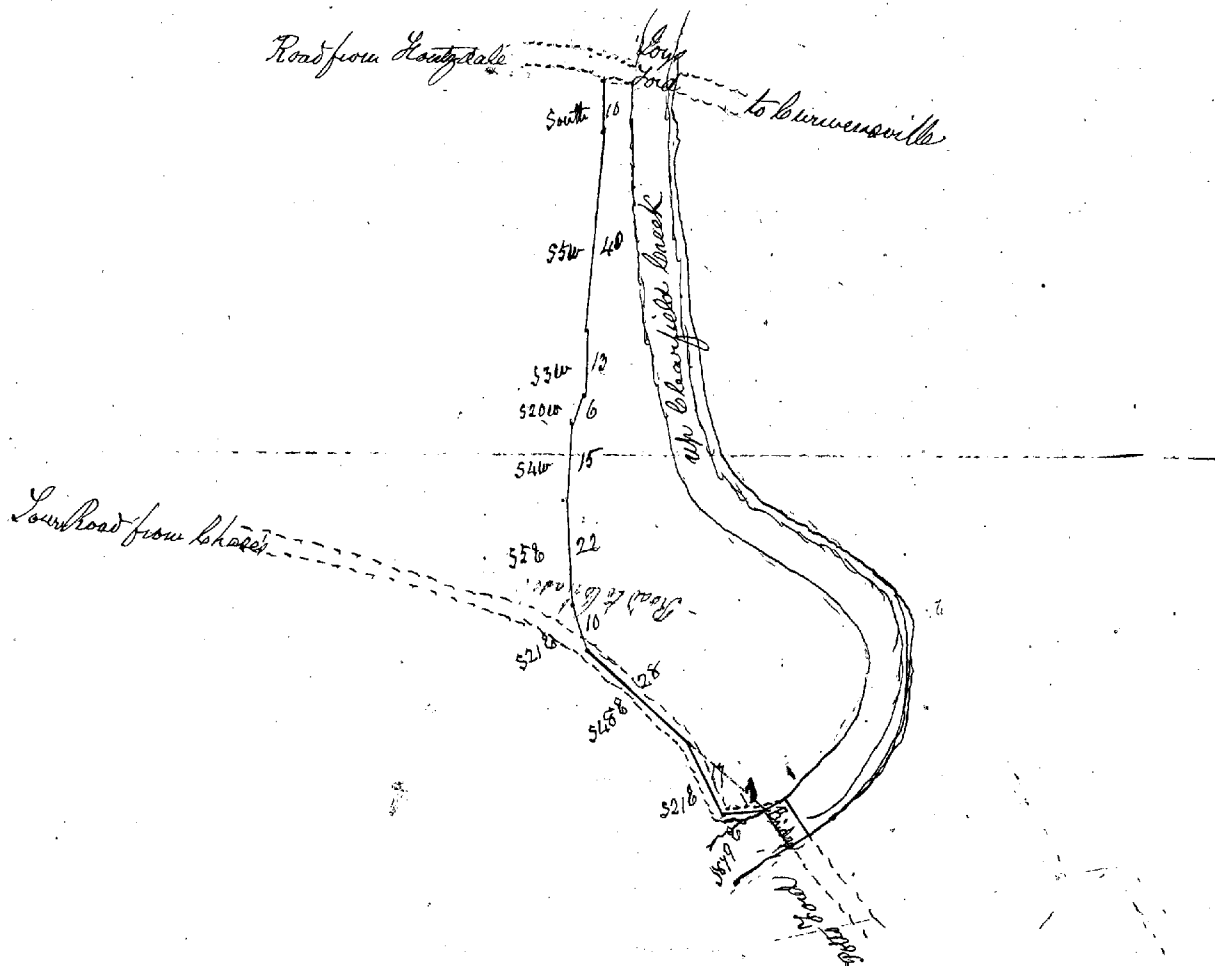
The undersigned viewers duly appointed in and by virtue of the
aforementioned order of Court to view and lay out a Public road from near Potts Run Fording
to Joys Fording. Respectfully Report.

That in pursuance of said order they gave due timely and legal notice
by advertisements duly posted for more than 5 days previous to making the view, of the time and
place of making the view, and on the day and at the appointed place they all met upon the
ground at the Potts Run Fording, and being first duly sworn or affirmed proceeded to view the
proposed route and proceeded to view and lay a road by the following courses & distances
Beginning at the abutment of the new Bridge at Potts Run Fording thence by old Township road
thence North seventy nine° East twelve perches, then South seventy one degrees East, ten
teen perches to stones on right side of road, South forty eight degrees East twenty eight perches
to stones by road to Chassie, thence South twenty one East ten perches, South five degrees East
twenty two perches, South four degrees West fifteen perches, South twenty degrees west 6
perches, South three West thirteen perches, South four degrees west forty perches, and thence
South ten degrees ten perches to public road east of Joys Fording, which we now return for
public use, and necessary for the convenience of the public, No Damages. A plot or draft is hereto
