At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28th day of May A. D.

1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Sandy in said county, setting forth that they labor

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ^{Vacate Supply} ~~J. L. Vosburg & J. Fuller~~

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. L. Vosburg & J. Fuller & George Brown

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.

Also— Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

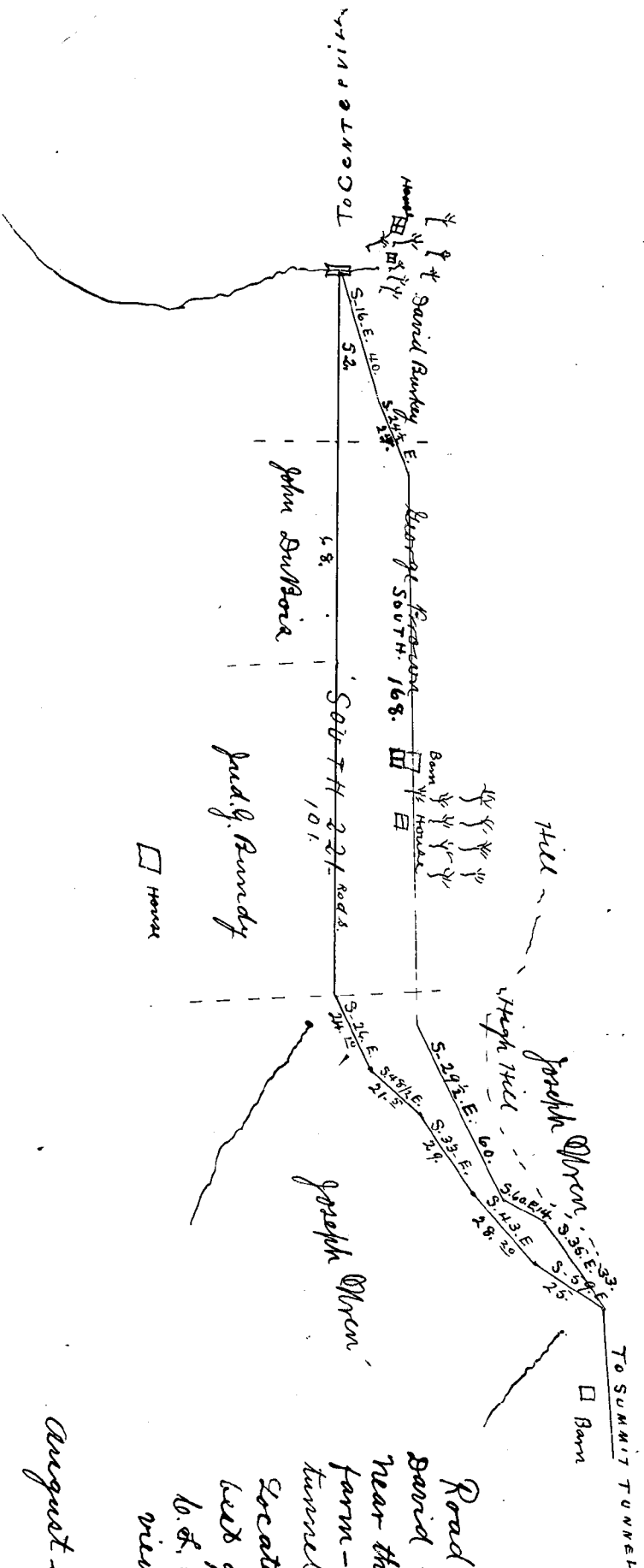
Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

To The Hon Judges Quarter Session,
We The undersigned viewers in

pursuance of the annexed met on the
premises or line of the proposed road on
August 24th — 1881 and after being
each duly sworn or affirmed proceed-
ed to examine and view the same
and laid out for public use the fol-

lowing road. Beginning at a point near
David Birtch, thence South 22¹/₂ perches,
thence S. 26° E. 24¹/₂ perches, thence S. 48¹/₂°
E. 21⁵/₁₀ perches, thence South 33° E. 29 perches,
thence South 43° E. 28³/₁₀ perches, thence S 58° 08'
25 perches to road from Centerville to Summit
Tunnel at a point near the south line of
Joseph Wren's farm, which road we adjudge
to be necessary for public use, and we
recreated all that portion of the old road
between said points not on the line as laid
out by us as above stated, we further ob-
tained releases from the land owners all ex-
cept Joseph Wren to whom we award the
sum of forty dollars damages.

To His Honorable the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of the Peace of Clearfield County.

The petition of the undersigned Citizens
and tax payers of Sandy Township in said
County would respectfully represent. That a
public road beginning at Summit Tunnel and
running nearly north to Boon's mountain
