At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28th day of May A. D.

1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Sandy

in said county, setting forth that they labor

^{and supply a} under great inconvenience for want of ^{to vacate} ~~Public~~ Road running between Summit
Tunnel and Boons Mountain at a point
near the residence of David Burkey and
ending at a point on said Road at
or near ~~the~~ ^{the} south line of David
Brooks farm

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~J. S. Vosburg & F. S. Fuller~~
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~J. S. Vosburg & F. S. Fuller & George Brown~~
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of Court.


NOTE.—In case of a Private Road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

We the undersigned viewers in
pursuance of the annexed met on the
premises or line of the proposed road on
August 24th 1881 and after being
each duly sworn or affirmed proceeded
to examine and view the same
and laid out for public use the fol-
lowing road. Beginning at a point near
David Brueys fence south 22° perches
thence S. 26° 8 24^{1/10} perches, thence S. 48^{1/2}°
8. 21 3/10 perches, thence south 33° 8. 29 perches,
thence south 43° 8. 28 2/10 perches, thence S. 58° 8
25 perches to road from Centerville to Summit
runnel at a point near the south line of
Joseph Wren's farm, which road we adjudge
to be necessary for public use, and we
recommend all & that portion of the old road
between said points not on the line as land
out by us as above stated, we further ob-
tained a release from the land owners all ex-
cept Joseph Wren to whom we award the
sum of forty dollars damages.

The petition of the undersigned citizens
and tax payers of Sandy Township in said
County would respectfully represent. That a
public road beginning at summit tunnel and
running nearly north to Boons mountain
where it connects with the Loyal ~~and~~ ^{Road}
~~Branch~~ all in the township of Sandy. Said
road was laid out by order of this Court.
And that said road is inconvenient in
its present location and would better
accommodate the public travel by being
changed at the following points. Beginning
