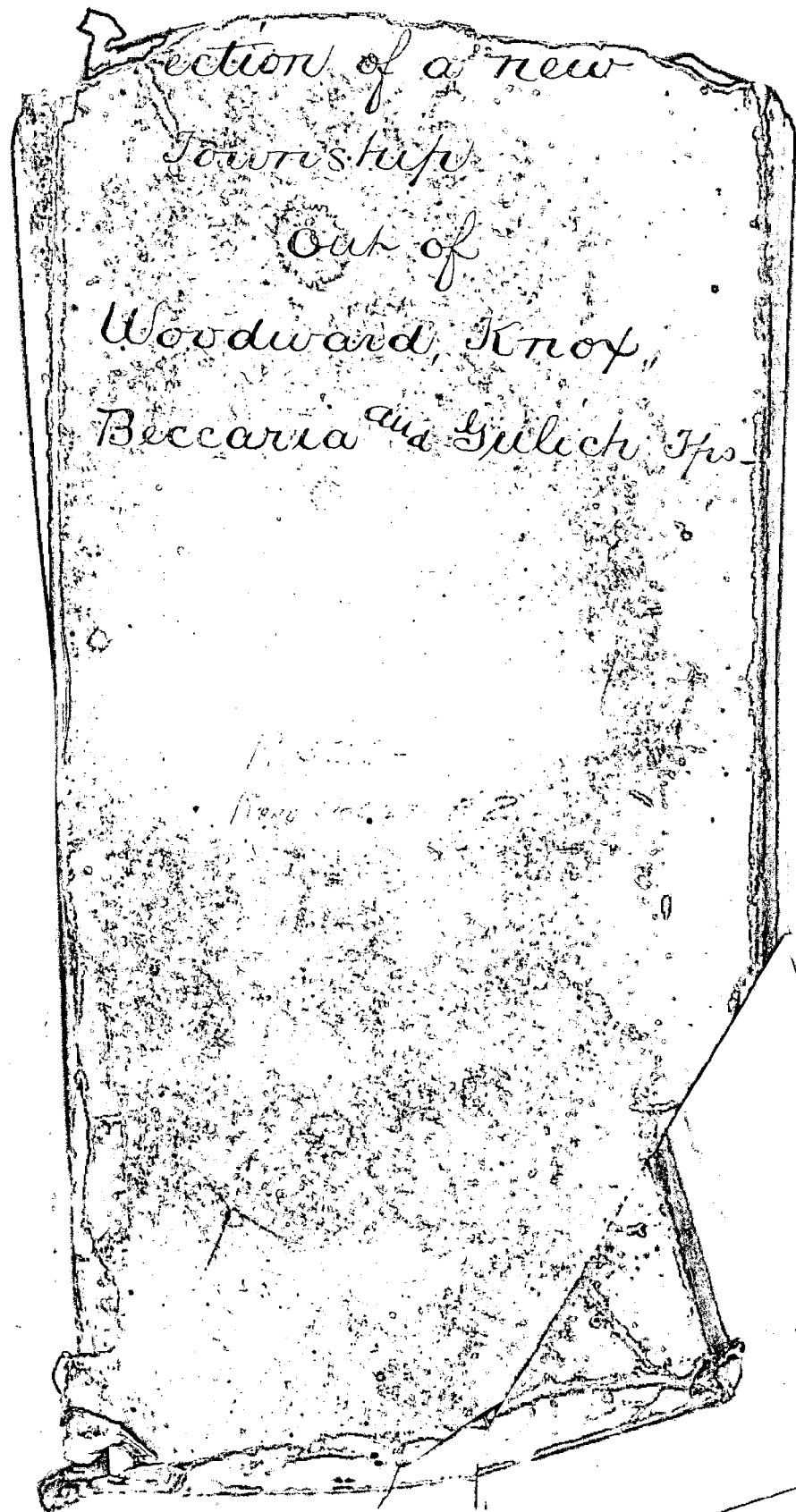

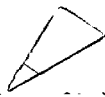

rized by law.

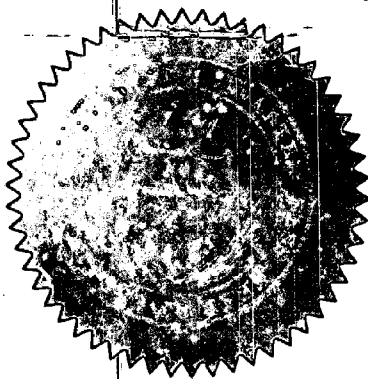

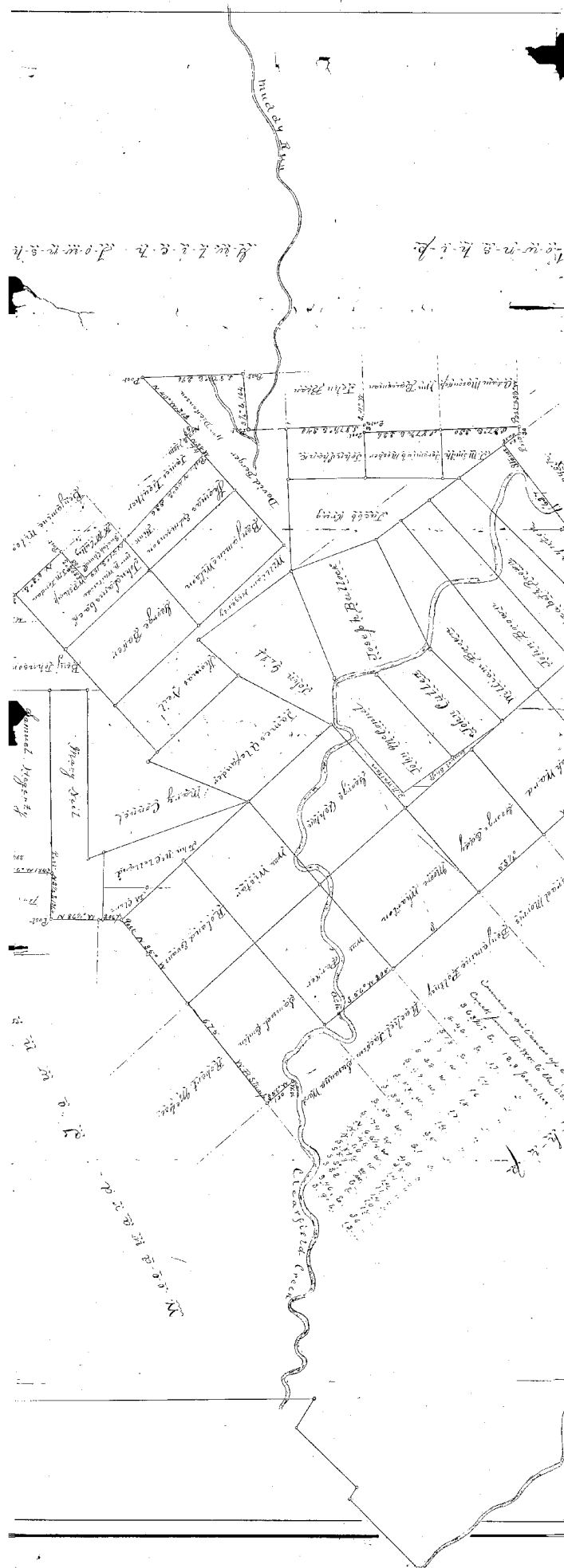
