



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county  
of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county,  
on the first day of Octo A. D.

188, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of  
sundry inhabitants of the Township of Greenwood  
in said county, setting forth that they labor under

Great inconvenience for want of a road or  
highway to lead from the publice road at the  
first fork of poplar run to the publice road  
at or near the Greenwood Township line

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out  
the same according to law, and make report to the Court  
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and  
appoint John S Cuttle Geo McRae W F Johnson  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their ap-  
pointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for  
said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that  
there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable  
to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for  
a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to pri-  
vate property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary  
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the  
courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it  
passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose  
lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the  
same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of  
Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state  
that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to  
be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within  
road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th rule of  
Court.

## RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

## ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

NOTE.—In case of a Private Road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also— Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

The undersigned viewers duly appointed by virtue of the Order of Court hereto annexed

Respectfully Report.

That having given due, timely and legal notice of the time and place of making the view they met upon the ground proposed for said road and being first duly affirmed to perform their duties as viewers according to law, proceeded to view the route and after a full examination have laid out and now return for Public use, a road by the following courses and distances: Beginning at a bridge on the Curvy Run road near the Greenwood Township line, thence  $870^{\circ} E.$  18 perches,  $182^{\circ} S. 12$  perches,  $872^{\circ} E.$  13 perches,  $825^{\circ} E.$  8 perches,  $533\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$  14 perches,  $550^{\circ} S.$  10 perches,  $553^{\circ} E.$  20 perches to a Maple,  $819^{\circ} E.$  20 perches to a Chestnut, South  $39^{\circ} E.$  14 perches to a Pine,  $550^{\circ} E.$  8 perches to a Hemlock, - South fifty six degrees East three perches, South fifty eight degrees East, six perches,  $588\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$  four perches, to Hemlock, North <sup>eighty</sup> fifty seven and one half degrees East 10 perches to a Hemlock, North seventy four East, seven perches to Rock Oak, North fifty five degrees East, ~~sixty~~ perches. North sixty two degrees East seventeen to fence of James Johnson's farm. thence through fields of James Johnson by line of tract surveyed for Blackburn tract North sixty degrees East seventeen perches to a Post - North two and one half degrees East forty six perches to post, North eighty four degrees East still through fields eighty perches to out edge of clearing, North fifty eight East thirty six perches. North eighty degrees East twenty six perches, North eighty seven degrees East twenty eight perches. South seventy degrees East twenty eight perches, South seventy degrees East forty four perches South fifty four degrees East, twenty eight perches, South seventy seven degrees East twenty four perches & South sixty four degrees East fourteen perches to the Public Road on Poplar Run.
