Viewers Fifth Street

versus

Borough of Clearfield

Contents:

To the Honorable the Judges
within named.

We the undersigned, appointed by the
annexed order of Court to view the premises
laid out and extend the North End of Fifth
Street in Clearfield Borough from the point
where said 5th St intersects Locust St to
a point on Pine Street, and assess the dam-
ages if any sustained by reason of the opening
of said Street, respectfully report: That we
met for the purpose of performing the duties
imposed on us by the said order on Saturday
the 6th day of January AD 1883, and having
been severally sworn or affirmed, accord-
ing to law, proceeded to view the premises proposed
for said street having regard to the advantages
and disadvantages caused to the several prop-
erties through which said Street passes
and along the line of and adjoining the said
Fifth Street. We assess and allow to George
W Rheem the sum of (\$300) Five hundred
dollars for damages for the taking of his
entire lot between Locust Street and Pine
Street - Forty feet of which is taken for the
Street and the balance (10) ten feet to be added
to the properties adjoining the said Street on
the West. And we assess for contribution
by reason of the advantages to their prop-
erties from opening said Street, as follows:
William A Wallace, (or) one hundred dollars
for the lot adjoining said Fifth on the East
and fronting on Locust Street, occupied

by four houses, being twenty, five dollar for each house and the grounds belonging thereto:

We assess for contribution, Timothy Heunery the sum of Fifty dollars for the lot adjoining Fifth St. on the East and fronting on Pine Street:

We assess for contribution William Wilhelm the sum of Two hundred dollars for the lot West of Fifth Street and fronting on Locust Street, extending the line of said lot from its present boundaries East (30) thirty feet to include the alley and ten feet of the lot of George W Rhum: We assess for contribution William A Wallace the sum of (50) one hundred and fifty dollars for the lot adjoining Fifth Street on the West, extending the line of said lot from its present boundaries East (30) thirty feet so as to include the alley and ten feet of the lot of George W Rhum: a draft or plot whereof accompanies this report.

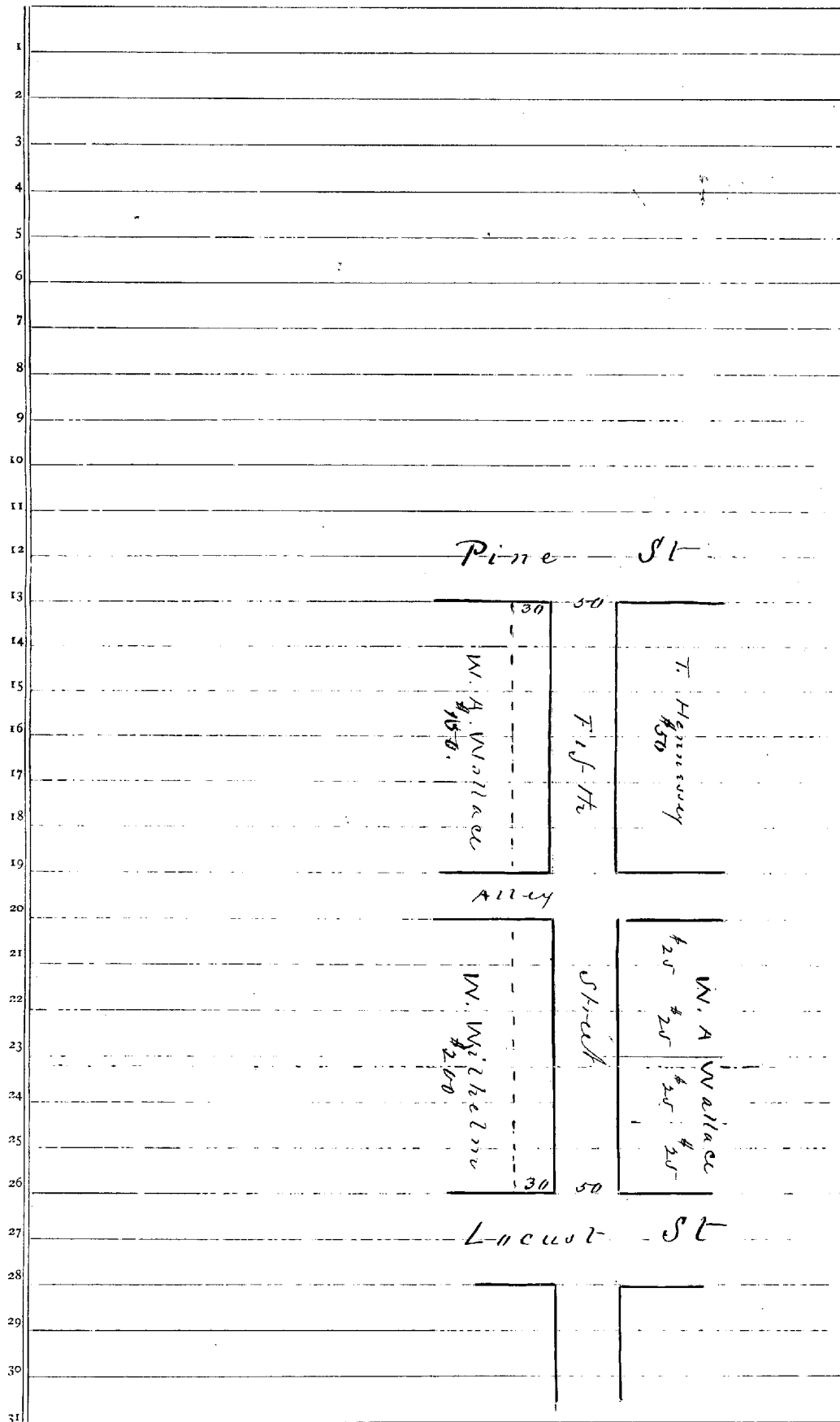

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said County, on the 27th Sept. 1882 before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of ~~Down~~ Council of the borough of Clearfield in said County setting forth that a Number of the Citizens of said borough have asked & requested your petitioners to appear before this Court & petition for the appointment of Viewers to view, lay out and extend the north end of Fifth Street in said borough from the point where said 5th St intersects Locust St to a point on Pine Street Your petitioners would therefore pray the Court to appoint proper persons to view & lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court to January Term 1883 Whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order & appoint G. L. Reed James Wrigley Clement W. Smith - D. W. Moore - W. C. Tooley Daniel Stewart & W. D. Bigler who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality & fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, or street and if a majority of the Viewers agree that there is occasion for such Street or opening they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners having respect to the best ground & in such a manner as to do least injury to private property, and shall also procure release of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained notice is

directed to be given to the owners or occupants of
sealed lands through which the within road is
intended to pass, of the time of the view -
