The petition
of the Undersigned inhabitants of the Townships of
Jordan and Beccaria in said County Respectfully Rep-
resent, that a public road was reported and confirm-
ed absolutely by your Honorable Court to Sept Term
1880 and Jan'y Term 1881, leading from a point at or
near James Reas in Jordan Township and to inter-
sect Public Road leading from Glen Stoper to Puseyville
or Wadsworth, which was reported to intersect said public
road at or near Joseph Stewart in Beccaria Township
that about one mile more or less of said road has
been opened for public use, ending at corner of
field of David Witherows, Your petitioners further hum-
bly pray, that to open the remaining portion of said
road as laid out would be both inconvenient and
burdensome, and they therefore pray that a surveyor
may be appointed to vacate so much of the said
Report as lays out a public road as aforesaid Beg-
inning at the corner of David Witherows field in Jor-
dan Township and thence leading by the several coun-
ses thereof as reported to the Public road aforesaid

at or near Joseph Stewart in Peccaria Township and
to supply the same by a public road Beginning at
or near the ~~Cross~~ of David Wetherows field as afore
said thence by the nearest and best route to intersect
the public road leading from Glentlope ~~abandon~~
to ~~Madison~~ at or near Mr Grooms in Pec
caria Township.

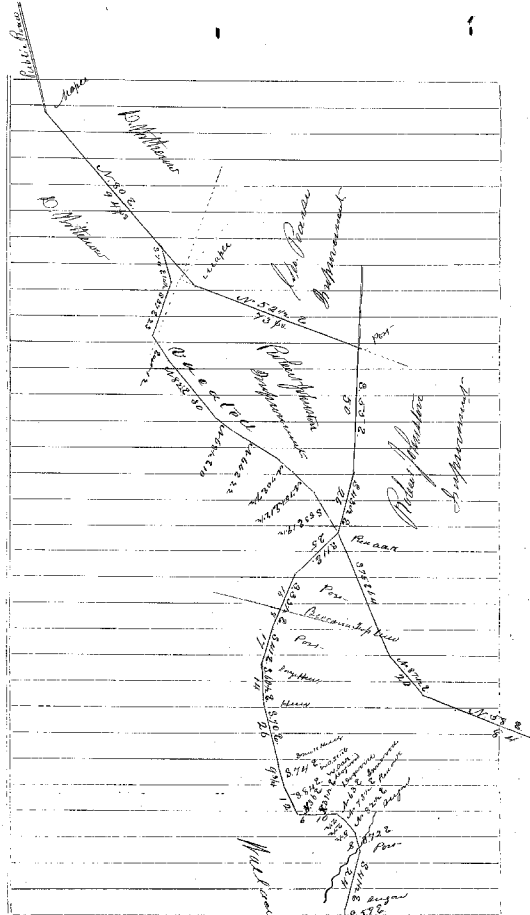

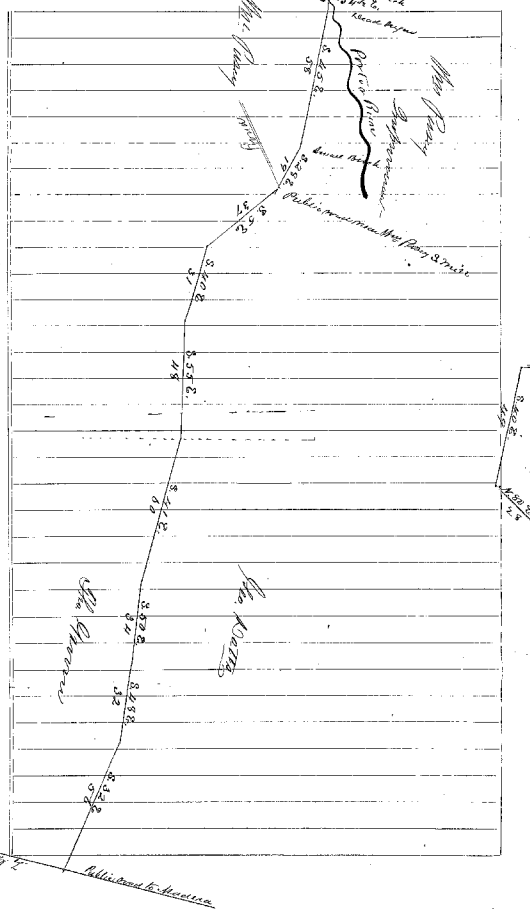

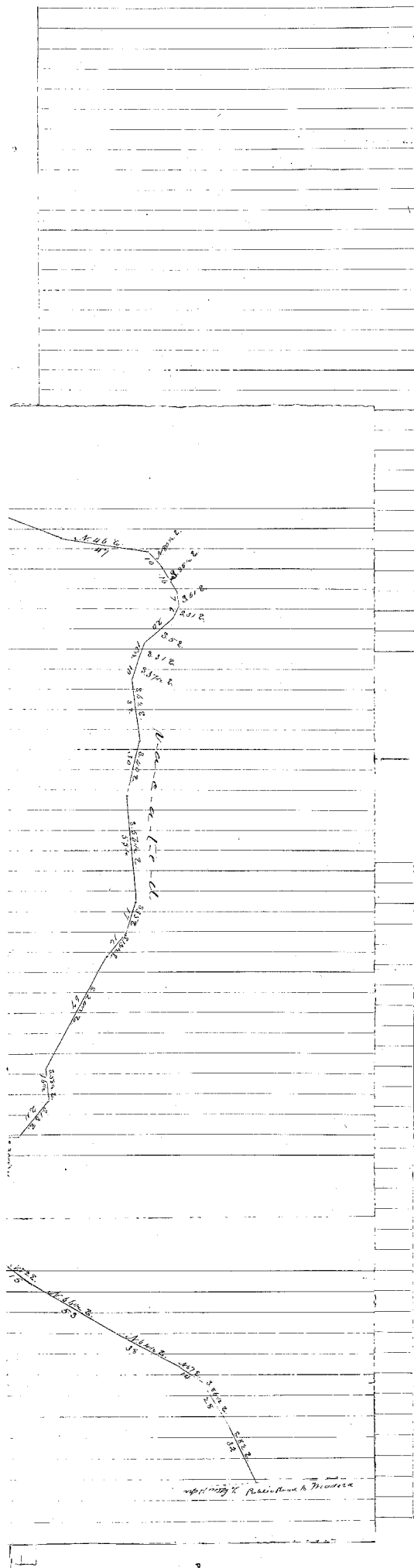

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of
Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the
22nd day of March, A. D. 1882
before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-
itants of the township of Jordan, in
said county, setting forth that *They labor*

*under great inconvenience for want of a public
Road and said inhabitants ask that a road
be viewed vacated and supplied from a
point at or near David Withers to a point
in Public Road leading from Glenhope to
Madera at or near Persons*

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same
according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint
Henry Swan Samuel Hagenty + Chas. B. Washburn
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
