 the said bridge, will amount to One thousand dollars

 to the Act of Assembly, in such case made and

We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the
foregoing Order of Court to view a Site for
a bridge in the Borough of Burnside. Do
Report that after having given due notice of the
time and place of said View, we all met and
after being duly Sworn and affirmed, did pro-
ceed to view the same, and are of the opinion
that the Bridge now in use crossing the Susque-
hanna River in the lower end of said Borough
is unsafe for public travel, and should be re-
placed with a new one and as the expense of
building said bridge would be greater than
would be reasonable for the inhabitants of said
borough to bear, we recommend that the County
should erect the same, and would respect-
fully recommend the matter to be laid before
the Grand Jury of the County, all which we
respectfully submit

ROAD VIEWERS' REPORT.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 12th day of January A. D. 1887, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the ^{Borough} ~~township~~ of Burnside, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from a bridge across the Susquehanna River at a point where the lower part of the Borough where the Curwensville & Cherry Tree Road crosses said stream

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Thomas McGee Levi Sunderland & Thos M Moore, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law. By the Court.
