We the undersigned persons appointed
by the Annexed Order of Court. To view, and en-
quire into the propriety of dividing the said Township
of Morris, in the County of Clearfield. Respectfully
Report. That being all present on the ground
at the time appointed, for the view of said Township
and being all sworn, or affirmed, in pursuance of the
said Order of Court. We have performed that duty, as
therein directed; and for the reasons set forth by your
Petitioners. it is our opinion that the said Morris
Township. ought to be divided, and formed into two
separate, and distinct Townships. And we therefore
proceeded to divide the same, by a marked line which
runs as follows. viz. Beginning at a Post the South
East Corner of Graham Township. On the line between
two tracts in the name of Michael, and Jacob Gratz.
Thence through Jacob Gratz. (now O. Pardee) South Six
degrees West. Sixty perches to a Point in the Township
Road. leading from Morris Dale to Kylertown. Thence
along another Township Road, South Eight and a
half degrees East. Twenty two perches. Thence South
Seventy nine perches. Thence South Seven and three quarters
degrees East. Forty two perches. Thence South One half
degree West. Sixty five perches to the line between Jacob
Gratz tract and. Kristain Wirtz. Thence along the line
between said tracts. And between said Pardee, and Miles

Johnson, South Eighty six degrees East. Thirty three perches
to a Post: Thence by the same. North four East. Two perches.
to a Post: Thence South Eighty Eight degrees East. Thirty perches
to a dead white pine. A corner of tracts in the name of Christian
Wintz, and Joseph Turner. Thence between said tracts, land now
owned by. Miles Johnson, and Adam Moyer. on the west, and
O. E. Schronover, on the East: South three and a half degrees west.
Three Hundred and Thirty Three perches to a Post; a corner
tracts in the name of Philip Wagner, and George Stabatten.
Thence through the Joseph Turner Survey, South Eighty Six and a
half degrees East: Twenty four perches to a Post; by a marked
white oak, on the west bank of Moshannon Creek ^(See ad line)

and south and a larger extent East & West
that as an Election district the number of Electors
within said Township are too great to vote at one
election house or precinct. And many other
inconveniences now exist ~~in the township~~

ing to law on the propriety of dividing said

At 5 September 7, 1882

And now 18th January 1884, the Returns of the Election held in the
above case having been duly returned and filed as required by law
and the same appearing to show that the majority was in favor of
the erection of a new township as proposed by the petitioners and
returned by the Report of the Commissioners appointed to view and
report in relation thereto,

Now therefore it is adjudged, ordered & decreed, that the territory
embraced in the plot or draft, plot or plan of the Commissioners and filed
herewith, be and is hereby divided, and the northern portion of said division
into a New Township which shall be and is hereby designated and known
as "Cooper" Township and the same to enjoy all the rights incident under
existing laws as "Cooper Township". And it is further ordered and decreed
that the Township shall hold the municipal and other elections at present
place of holding elections at the Village of Hylentown and that Henry
Hoover shall act as Judge of Elections, D. W. Roof as majority Inspector
and George Hullerton as Minority Inspector, until election officers ~~are~~
shall be legally elected as provided for under & by existing laws.

And it is further adjudged, ordered & decreed, that the southern portion of
said division is also formed, designated and known as "Morris Town-
ship", and the same to enjoy all the rights incident under existing laws
as "Morris Township", and it is further ordered and decreed that the said
Township shall hold the municipal and other elections at the house of B. H.
Watkins near Morrisdale Mines, and that D. H. Waring shall act as

as judges of election, V. G. Merrell as majority Inspector and
John Hollowbough minority Inspector, until election officers shall
be regularly elected as provided for by existing laws, at the ensuing February
elections for the year 1884. And the constable of Old Morris Township
is hereby authorized and ordered to advertise the election of both Cooper & Morris
townships, and the time and place where said elections are to be held and to
give notice to the appointed officers of the several duties imposed upon them
by that officers,

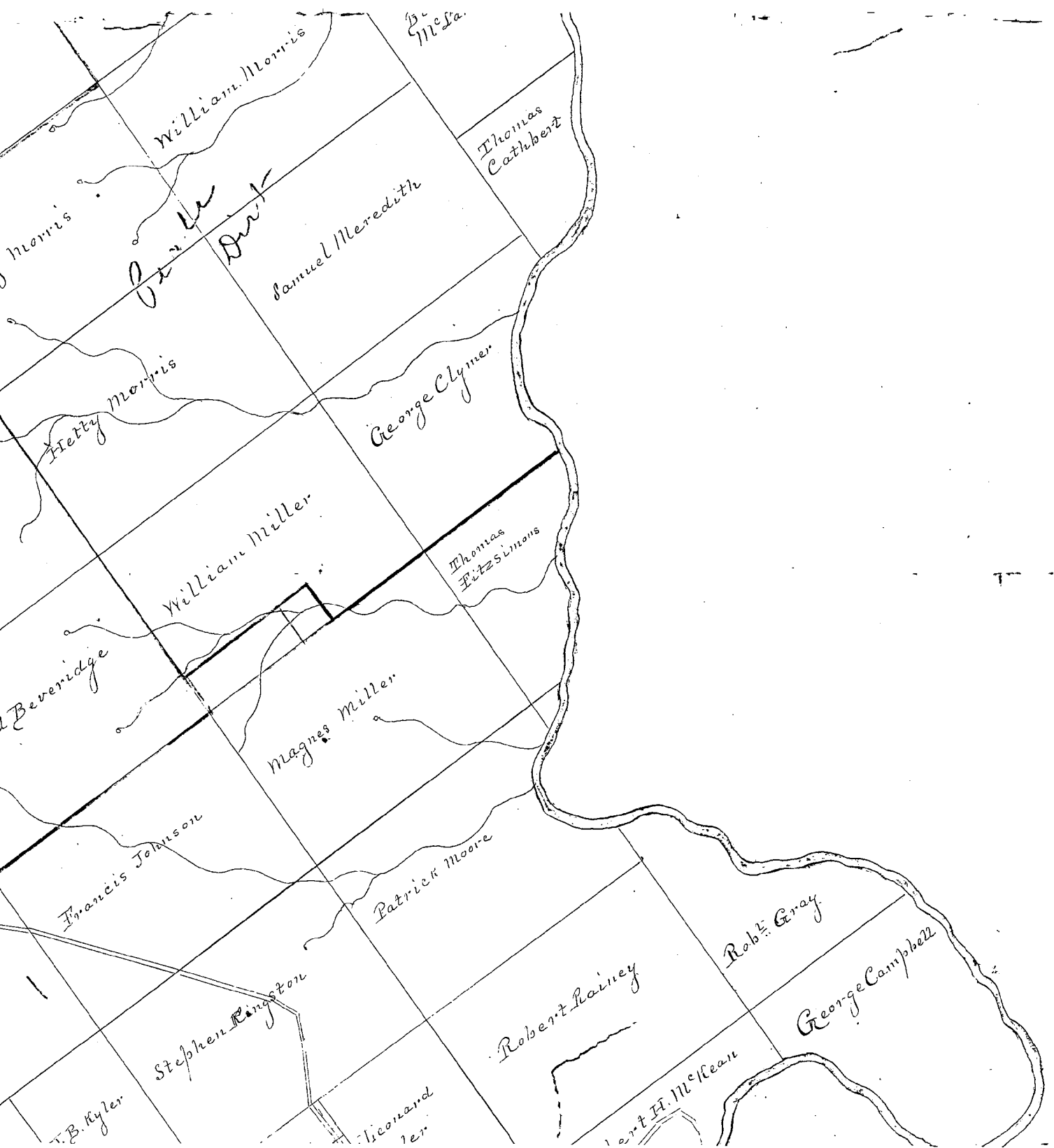

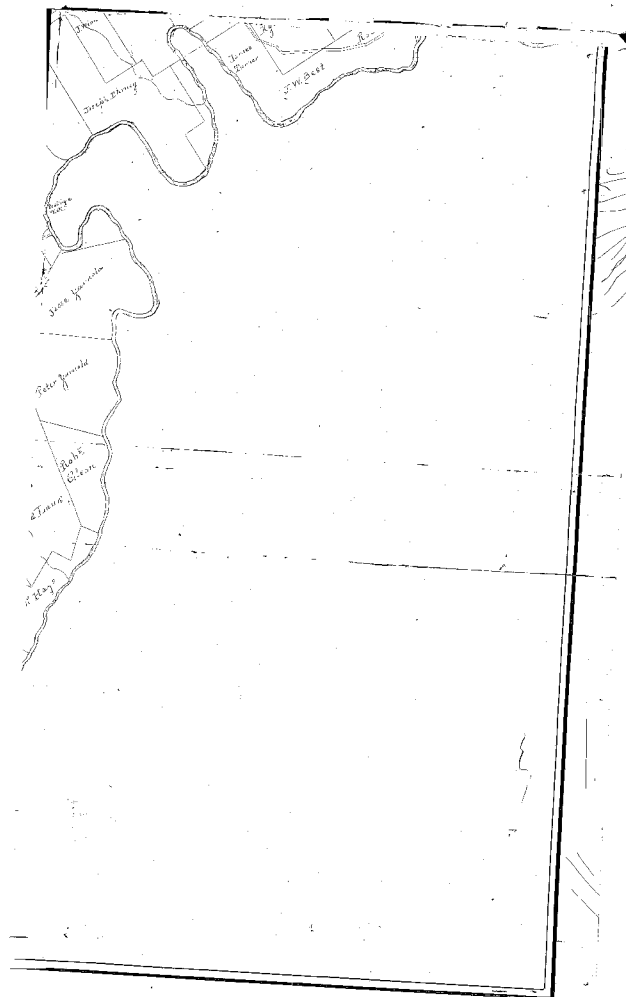

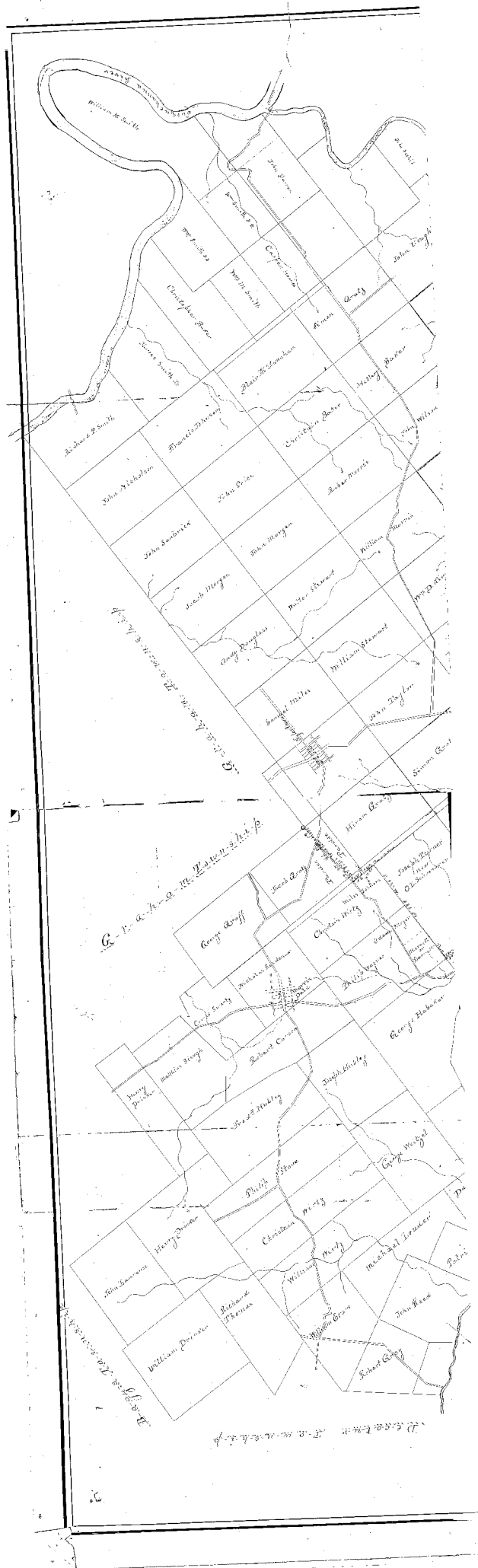
