At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 16 day of January, A. D. 1882, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

Great Inconvenience for want of a Public Road to lead from a point at or near the residence of Rodney Gilliom in Brady Township to intersect Public Road at or near Wingert School House in said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo C Kirk Geo Knarr and Martin H Luther who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewer's agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

## ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

The following persons, having refused to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and the opening of the said road in the annexed return described, we, the undersigned viewers, under oath in pursuance of our duty, under the Act of Assembly do assess their damages and make report thereof, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Judges within named: We the undersigned appointed by the annexed order do report; That in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn according to law, all the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner, as in our opinion, shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road to wit: - Beginning at a post in public road near Godfrey Billings, thence  $54^{\circ} W.$  Sixty-one perches to a post, thence still on land of said Godfrey Billings,  $21.86^{\circ} W.$ , Sixty-five perches to a Hemlock, on unseated land of J. B. England; thence,  $3.77^{\circ} W.$  Twenty-four perches; thence  $5.56\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} W.$  Eleven and  $\frac{9}{10}$  perches to a Hemlock. thence  $5.73\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} W.$  Forty-two perches to a post; thence West on line between lands of H. L. Hartzell on the South, and H. Wingert on the North, forty-six and  $\frac{6}{10}$  perches to a post in public road at Wingert School House, said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees. We further report that there are no damages resulting to any one of the owners of the land over which said road passes. That before said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity - ten days before said meeting - written notice was given of said meeting, to H. L. Hartzell and H. Wingert, owners of seated lands over which said road passes, and we annex a plot or draft of said road, laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes.

Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by  
the original viewers, except so far as the location may be  
changed by the new viewers.  
By—In the event that parties to the adjustment as  
well as the original viewers, find construction of the road, they will report to  
that effect.
