We the undersigned Seivers of  
permitted by the annexed Order of Court to view  
and lay out the road therein mentioned has  
punctually Report that we met on the ground on  
the day appointed, and being all present, and all  
being duly sworn or affirmed, in presence of  
the said order of Court, we did view and lay  
out, and do return the following road, viz: The  
in the township road  
beginning at a post in James Purdy's sugar Camp  
thence through land of E. A. Davis south four and  
a half degrees west twenty-two perches to a post,  
on the bank of Chest creek, thence by said  
creek south forty-two and a half degrees east fifteen  
perches to a post, south thirty-three degrees east  
sixteen perches to a post, south six degrees east  
twenty-three perches to a post, south fourteen degrees  
and a half degrees east nine perches to a post,  
south thirty-nine degrees east twenty-three perches  
to a post, south fourteen and a half degrees west  
west four perches to the end of the bridge across the said  
Chest creek at William H. Agnew's house which said  
road as above described we are of opinion is neces-  
sary for public use - a draft whereof is hereto annexed.


We are further directed by the said Order  
to vacate the road from the East side of said  
creek to the Township road leading to the Washing-  
ton, which duty we have performed, and do return  
the following road, which we declare vacated  
beginning at the Township road leading to

1 New Washington at the end of James Ceney's  
2 lane, thence through land of James Ceney north  
3 twenty degrees east twenty-eight perches; north twelve  
4 and a quarter degrees east eighteen perches; south  
5 eighty-nine and a half degrees east fourteen  
6 perches; north twenty-five degrees east ten perches;  
7 north twenty and a half degrees west nine perches;  
8 north thirteen degrees east ten perches; north fifty-  
9 eight degrees east ten perches; thence through land  
10 of E. A. Levin south thirty degrees east twenty-two  
11 perches to a post in the line of road returned in  
12 this report as shown by the red lines on the an-  
13 nounced draft

14 There are no damages claimed for  
15 the above road, and no person, in our opinion,  
16 is entitled to any.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the

20<sup>th</sup> day of March, A.D. 1883

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Chest,

in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a Public Road the Petitioners & others being to lay out a Public Road from Magness to intersect the Public Road at or near James Burry's Sugar Camp and also vacate a Road starting on the East side of Chest Creek and intersecting the New Washington Road at or near the end of James Burry's Lane

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Samuel McColaugh & W. Moore & John Patterson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
