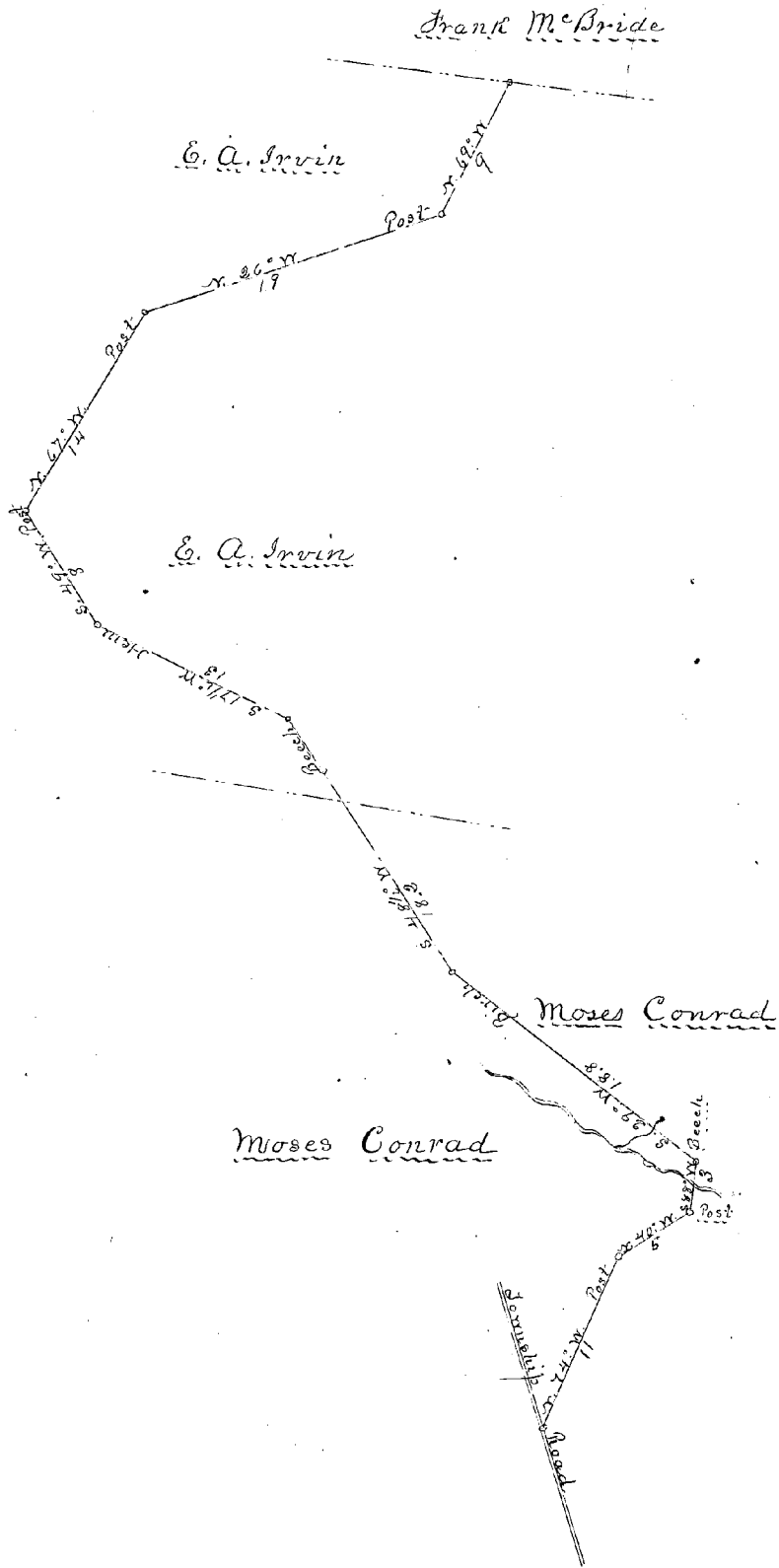
We, the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court, to view and lay out the Road therein mentioned, respectfully report that having given notice of the time, and place of meeting according to the Act of Assembly, and being all present at the view of the ground proposed for the said Road, and being all sworn, or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order of Court. We have viewed and laid out, and do return, the following Road, viz: Beginning at a Post by marked trees, in the Township Road leading to Wall's Mill, in Bloom Township. Thence through land of Mass. Conrad, North Seventy four degrees west, Eleven perches to a Post; Thence North forty degrees west, five perches to a Post; Thence South Eighty Eight degrees west, Three perches to a Beech. Thence South Twenty nine degrees west, Eighteen and Eight tenths perches to a Birch. Thence still through land of Conrad, and land of E. A. Irvin South forty Eight and a half degrees west, Eighteen and two tenths perches to a Beech. Thence South seventeen and a half degrees west, Thirteen perches to a Hemlock, Thence ^{South} forty nine degrees west, Eight perches to a Post. Thence North Sixty Seven degrees west, fourteen perches to a Post. North Twenty Six degrees west, nineteen perches to a Post. Thence still through land of E. A. Irvin, North Sixty nine degrees west, nine perches to the line of E. A. Irvin and Frank McBride, near his Residence.

Which said Road, as aforesaid laid out, we are
of Opinion is necessary for a Public Road. A Plot
on Draft whereof is herewith annexed.

And we are of Opinion that no person through
whose Land the said Road passes, is entitled to any

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of
Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the
2nd day of October, A. D. 1882
before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-
itants of the township of Bloom, in
said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a Public road
to lead from leading from the residence of
Frank M. Bride in Bloom Township and
to Halls Mill at or near Moses Courads in
Run Top

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same
according to law, make report to next Term
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint
S. J. McCloskey H. P. Chambers & Arnold Bloom
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
