The undersigned remonstrators inhabitants
of the Townships of Cornington and Karthaus in
the said County very respectfully represent that
at the September Sessions of your Honorable Court
a Petition was presented by the inhabitants of
Cornington and Karthaus Townships praying for the
appointment of viewers to view and lay out a Road
for Public use starting at a point near the
Township line of Cornington and Karthaus on the
turnpike to a point on the Susquehanna and
Clearfield Rail Road at or near Plough's Garden

That said Petition fails to state that any
inhabitant of said Township labor under inconve-
nience for want of said Road - That the said
proposed road will be nearly three miles in
length and traverses unimproved lands that
there are very few settlers on the line of the said
proposed road, and that there are serious defects
in the proceedings thereon. That the said road if
confirmed by your Court will impose a great
burden on the taxable inhabitants of said townships
and that it is unnecessary, and not required by the
inhabitants of said Townships They therefore
pray that your Honorable Court may refuse to
confirm the Report of the said Viewers and

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26th day of Sept, A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Karthaus, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

great Inconvenience, for want of a Public Road, starting at or near the Township line of Levington & Karthaus Twp on the Turn = pike to a point on the Susquehanna and Clearfield Rail Road at or near Ploughs Garden

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint L. M. Courdier, Lawrence Flood & E. C. Reed who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
