

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22 day of Mar, A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Beaver, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want a public Road leading from George Kirk's mill in Beaver up to the Public road at or near Gainer Stones camp

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo C Kirk m Et Luther and John Smith who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

ted by the annexed order do report, That in pursuance thereof, after having
been severally duly sworn according to law, all the viewers appointed by
said order, viewed the grounds proposed for the within mentioned road,
and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petition
ers, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had
respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have
laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion, do the least injury to pri-
vate property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners,
and do occur for public use the following described road, to wit: Beginning
at a post in the public road near Gainer Lines Camp; thence East, on line
between Gainer Lines and Perry H. Belnett on the North, and J. B. England and
Wm Gainsford on the South, One hundred and ninetynine (99) perches to a
Cucumber (Down), thence South, on line of lands between Perry H. Belnett and
N. E. Arnold on the East and Wm Gainsford, John Whitmore and S. Sabordi,
on the west, one hundred and ninetynine (99) perches to a pine stump
thence S. 44° E, fifty-one (51) perches to a white Oak; thence S. 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W, eight (8) perches
to a post; thence S. 60 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W, twelve (12) perches to a post; thence S. 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E, thirty-two (32)
perches to a post in the public road near Geo. Korb's saw mill.
We further report, that there are no damages resulting to any one through who
ever land said road passes, from operating the same. That before said view,
public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given
by advertisements put up in the vicinity, and we annex a plot or draft
of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly
the improvements through which the same passes.

Also, Surveyors will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out of the road or other return. Reviewers cannot interfere with dimensions as assessed by the original Surveyors, except so far as the location may be changed, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
