CLEARFIELD COUNTY, & SS:*

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26th day of Sept., A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Kaintraus, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway to lead from a point at or near the post office at three runs thence by the nearest and best route to the station of the Susquehanna and Clearfield Rail road at or near the mouth of three runs.

And also to Vacate a public road leading from three runs School House to the Susquehanna River at Buttermilkddy.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~and make report to the Court~~ Vacate whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~B. M. Leander, L. S. Hood, T. E. G. Read~~ ^{vacation} who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

I the undersigned and one of the viewers within
named would respectfully report that on the
9th Day of October 1883 the day appointed to
view the road within named and notice of the time
and place for viewers to meet having been given accord-
ing to law, went upon the ground and met a number
of the Petitioners who informed me that a Station had
not been located at the RR. within named at or
near the mouth of "3" Run, and as the road asked
for to be of any benefit to the petitioners should be
laid out to said Station. Since that time the S & C
RR. Co. has built a branch road up the said Run to
the P.O. within named and has in many places
taken up the ground for the proposed public Road
and the said Company has located a Station a
short distance above the rafting ground at Butter
Milk Eddy and Mess. Weaver & Batts have built a good
road a portion of the way and repaired the road proper
to be vacated by the within order from the last point above
named to "3" Run School House. I make
this report to show reasons for not laying out the road as
per within order. After ~~notifying~~ seeing petitioners on the
date above mentioned I notified viewers not to attend.
