At a court of Quarter Sessions of the peace of the County of Clearfield held at Clearfield in and for said County on the 12th Jan'y 1833 before the Judges of said Court upon the Petition of John A. Fulton of the Township of Loshen setting forth that a Public Road was laid out in said Town from mouth of small run above old Selfridge house to a point near the water Trough on Robert Hegals farm in said Township which passes through the Petitioners farm for a distance of about one half mile Cutting his property in such a way as to seriously injure the same by cutting off from his place for the whole of the distance a narrow strip varying from three to ten rods. About ninety rods in length of said strip is cleared and was part of a large and valuable pasture field containing a valuable Spring Run which is by said road cut entirely off from the balance of said field. That the said named strip is by reason of its being cut off from the balance of the farm rendered Almost Valueless ^{And} is also by reason of its being so cut off a serious injury to the balance of the property. Petitioner is Obligated ^{also} to build over one hundred rods of fence. And therefore

Praying the Court to appoint a Jury of six disinterested persons to View the premises and Assess the damages sustained by the

To The Hon Judges of The Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Penna.

The petition of John A. Sullivan a citizen of Goshen Township said County respectfully represents:

That by report of view & filed to Nov 9. Sept Sess 1880 of said Court and confirmed absolutely by said Court on 22 May 1882 there was laid out a public road in said township from mouth of Small Run above old Selfridge House to a point near the water trough on Robert Hughes farm in said township which passes through petitioners farm for a distance of about one half mile cutting his property in such a way as to seriously injure the same by cutting off from his place for the whole of the distance a narrow strip varying from three to ten rods, about ninety rods in length of said strip is cleared and was part of a large and valuable pasture field containing a valuable spring ~~well~~ which is by said road cut entirely off from the balance of said field. That the said narrow strip is by reason of its being cut off from the balance of the farm rendered almost valueless and is also by reason of its being so cut off a serious injury to the balance of the property. Petitioner is obliged also to build over one hundred rods of fence. That said order of Court confirming said road was followed by an order to open the same issued on May 24th 1882 — to the proper officers of said township in pursuance of which they have endeavored to open the same. Again petitioner further showing that he is injured and damaged by reason of the location of said road as he verily believes of not less than one hundred and twenty (120) and further showing that no compensation or damages whatever were awarded him
