CLEARFIELD COUNTY, & SS: \*

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of June, A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in said county, setting forth that a road has long since been laid out from Henry Daumbarger in Bradford Twp. to intersect public road at or near Barney McGovern in Girard Twp., a part of said Beginning at the place where Mr. Knepp's private road intersects said road in Bradford Twp. to where the said road crosses the Susquehanna river at Gallow Harbor in Bradford Twp. is now useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said Twp.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~Joseph Moon and Martin Woolridge~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~Joseph Moon~~ ~~Saul P. Wilson and~~ ~~John Woolridge~~ who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Report, that in pursuance of said appointment, after having first given due notice of the time and place of meeting by advertisements set up according to law, we all met and being duly affirmed we have viewed the same and are of opinion that a part of said wood is useless, and burthenous to the inhabitants of said township we have therefore vacated the part as aforesaid beginning at the Susquehanna River at the mouth of a small Run, then South  $20^{\circ}$  East Ten perches - South  $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West. Eighteen perches - South fifty two Degrees West Three perches - North  $40^{\circ}$  West Six perches - North  $64^{\circ}$  West. Six perches - South  $68^{\circ}$  West Six perches - North  $79^{\circ}$  West. 33 perches - North  $69\frac{1}{2}$  Degrees West 13 perches - North  $80\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West - 23 perches. North  $88^{\circ}$  West 24 perches. South <sup>four</sup> Sixty one half degrees, West  $5\frac{1}{2}$  Perches - South  $56^{\circ}$  West. Fifteen and three tenths Perches.
