



To the Honorable Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the foregoing order of Court to view the said therein described Do Report that after having first given due notice by advertisements put up according to law of the time and place of meeting and notice having also been given to owners and occupants of lands through which said road was intended to pass of the same. we all met and bring duly affirmed we have viewed the ground for said proposed road and it is our opinion that said road is necessary for the inhabitants of said Township and the Public generally we have therefore viewed laid out and do return for Public use the following to wit Beginning at a Point on Public road near Mr. Hullihens House South fifty four and one half degrees west thirty one Perches to a Hemlock - North Eighty six degrees west twenty seven perches to a Post - North Thirty degrees west - twenty six Perches to a Post - North Sixty five degrees west - Six Perches to a Hemlock - South Sixty one degrees west. Five Perches to a Hemlock - North Seventy five degrees west Six Perches to a Hemlock North fifty three degrees west Thirteen Perches to a Post - North forty seven degrees west Eighteen Perches to a Sugar tree - North forty one degrees west

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the

21<sup>st</sup> day of March, A.D. 1883,

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Greenwood, in

said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway to lead from the Township Road at Mathias Hulchens to the Township road near Ogden Campbell in Said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make Report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

J. W. Moore in M. Flynn and Genas Hoover

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
