The undersigned citizens of Sandy Twp and  
vicinity respectfully represent that they labor  
under great inconvenience for want of a  
public road leading from a point at or  
near the white schoolhouse on the line of Durbin  
Twp. to a point at or near the Reynoldsville  
road between Elihu Dixons and the Fox Hocking  
school house in Sandy Twp.  
They also represent that the road leading from  
the Shoenaker hill to Elihu Dixons is useless  
and burdensome and they pray this Honorable  
Court that the same may be vacated according  
to the act of assembly in such cases made and  
provided: and that a viewers may be appointed  
to view and lay out the said road leading from  
the white school house to the Reynoldsville road  
near Elihu Dixons. and they will ever pray

## CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:~

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of  
Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the  
24<sup>th</sup> day of Oct, A. D. 1883,  
before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-  
itants of the township of Sandy, in  
said county, setting forth that they labor under great

inconvenience for want of a public road leading from  
a point at or near the white school house on the line  
of DuBois Borough to a point at or near the Reynolds-  
ville road between Elisha Diphons and the Joe Heberling  
School House in Sandy Twp. They also represent  
that the road leading from the Shoemaker hill  
to Elisha Diphons is useless and burdensome and  
they pray the Court to have the same vacated

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same  
according to law, and make report to the Court  
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint  
Geo C Kirk & M Luthoff and W J Ross  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment  
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they  
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,  
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having  
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do  
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary  
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and  
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure  
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to  
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof  
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall  
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be  
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended  
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 14<sup>th</sup> Rule of Court.

NOTE: In favor of a Private Road, the release must be executed in front of the postholder for said road.

Also— Viewers with the amount owed the number of days employed and set the amount on the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere so far as the location may be changed by the postholder.

N.B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
