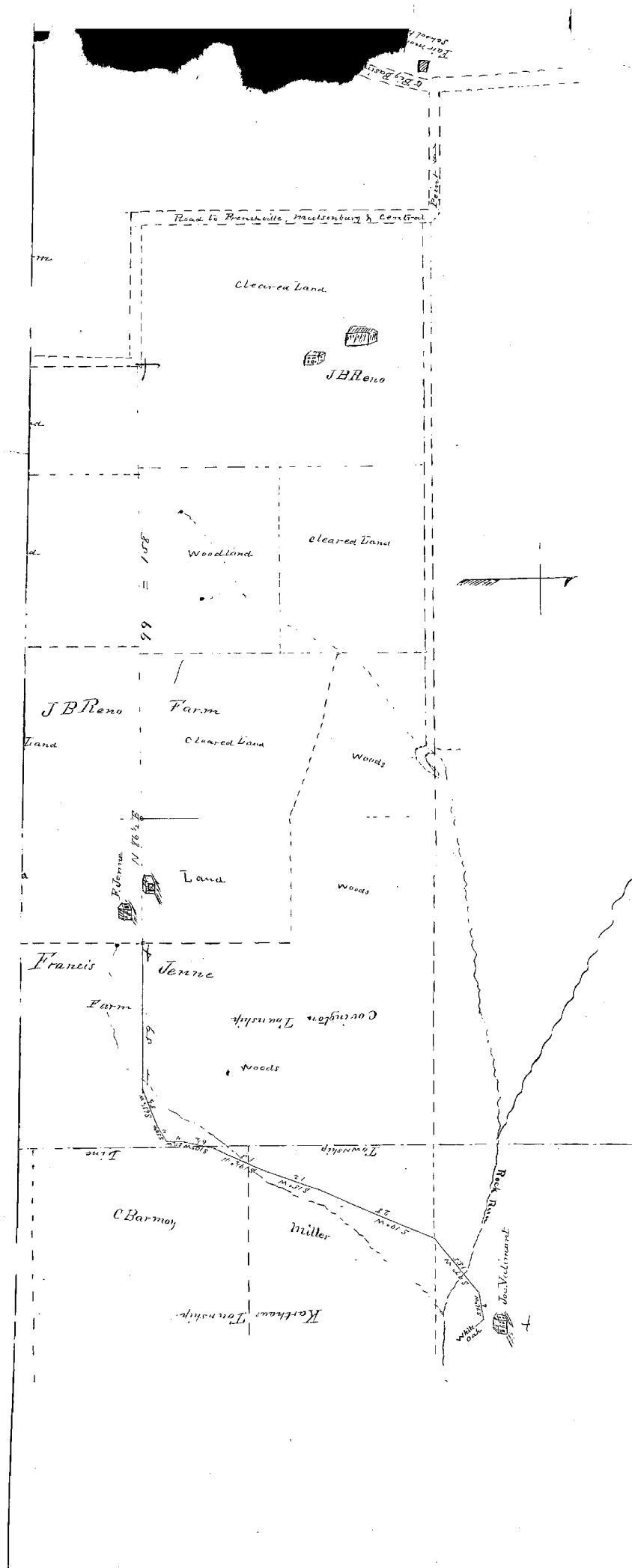

# CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:3

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of Sept, A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cornington Karthaus, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a Public Road or highway to lead from a point at or near Joseph Valimonts house in Karthaus Township to intersect the public road known as the Askey road in Cornington Township at a point at the north East corner of the Joseph Royer farm now owned by Mrs B Reno

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint E. C. Read. Robert Stewart and L. A. Woods

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 14<sup>th</sup> Rule of Court.

Sirs. We the undersigned viewers appointed to  
view and lay out a road in Karthaus & Coov-  
ington Twp. in accordance with the within order  
after giving lawful notice of the time and place  
of meeting did go upon the ground and after  
being sworn according to law proceeded to view  
the ground proposed for said road and did  
lay out a road as follows beginning at an  
oak tree near the house of Joe Delmonte in Kar-  
thaus twp thence S 76° W 6 Perches + S 47° W 15½ perches  
S 19° W 28 perches + S 15° W 12 perches S 19½° W 13 perches  
S 10° W 6½ perches S 1½° W 4 perches S 50° W 4 Perches S  
63½° W 8½ perches thence N 86½° W 158 perches to Askey  
Road at N E Corner of Jno B Royer Farm in Coovington  
Twp.

But after laying out the foregoing <sup>described</sup> road we found it did  
not suit a majority of the petitioners and in our opinion  
is not where a road to be of any benefit to the said  
petitioners should be and under this order it was impos-  
sible for us to lay out a road between the points within  
mentioned that would be better. we have given a draft  
of the ground and from it you can see why we do not

NOTE.—In case of a Private Road, the review must be executed by favor of the petitioner to said road. Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the review.

As the review the parties are not entitled to damages taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
