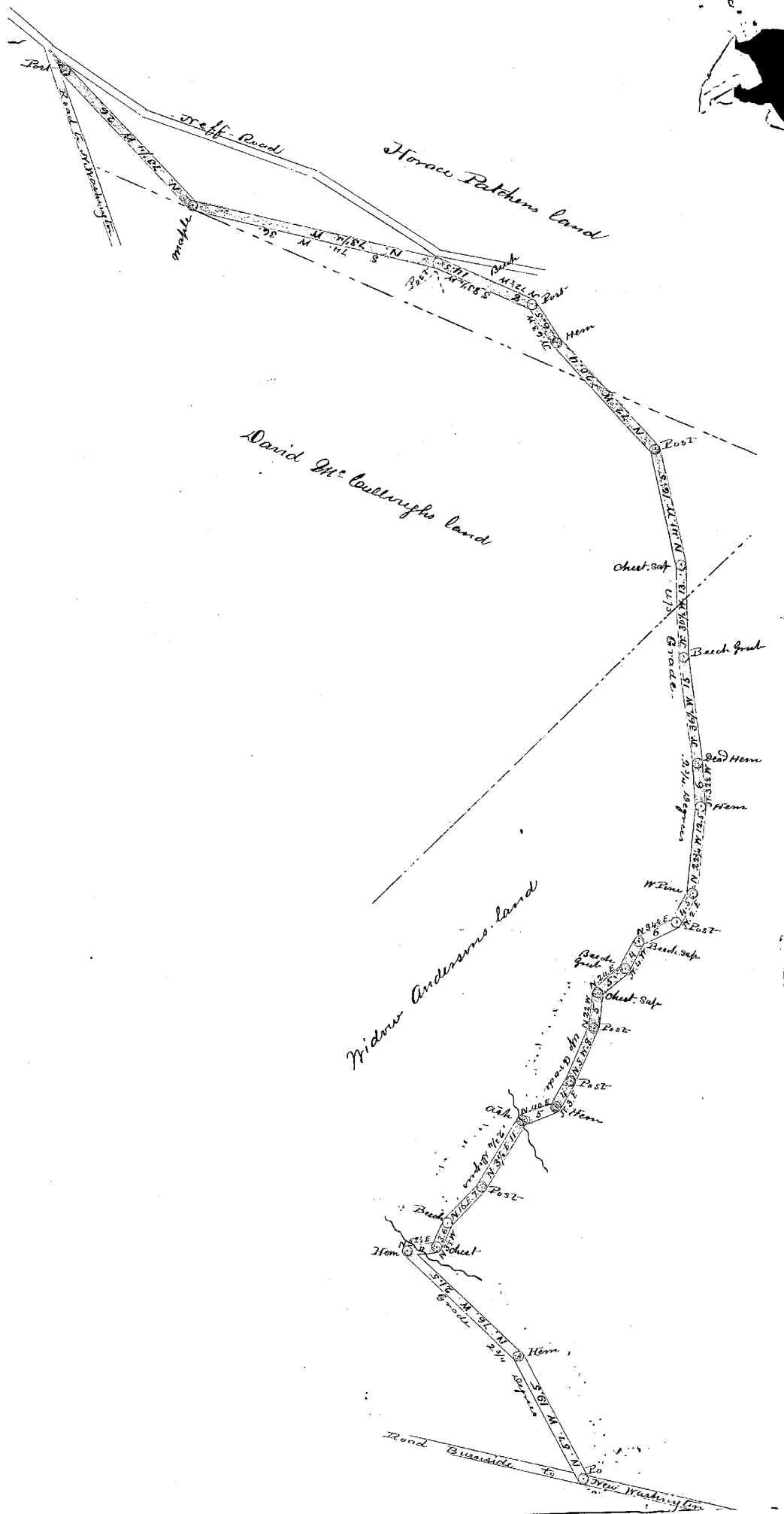

To the Honorable Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions for Cleaveland County We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the foregoing order of Court to View the road therein described, Do Report that after having given due notice of the time and place of meeting by advertisements put up according to law and having given notice to owners and occupants of land through which said road was intended to pass of the same we all met and being duly Affirmed we have viewed laid out and do return for public use the following road viz- Beginning at a Post on the Public road leading from Burnside to New Washington at a point about 8 Rods East of Riddles lane thence down grade of two & three fourths degrees, by the following- North fifty seven degrees west nineteen & one half Perches to a Hemlock. North Seventy six degrees west. Twenty one & one half Perches to a Hemlock. North fifty two & one half degrees East Four Perches to a Chest- North three & one half degrees west. Three & six tenths perches to a Beech. North Sixteen degrees East Seven Perches to a Post- North three and one half degrees East. Eleven Perches to an Ash- North Forty degrees East Five Perches to a Hemlock- North three degrees East. Four Perches to a Post- North five degrees west. Eight perches. to a Post- North twenty two degrees west. Five Perches to a Chestnut Sapling- North twenty four degrees East. Five Perches to a Beech knob- North four degrees west- Four perches to a Beech Sapling North thirty four and one half degrees East Six perches to a

Post. North two degrees East, Four & one half Perches
to a w Pine. North twenty two & three fourths degrees
west. Twelve & one half Perches to a Standover. North
thirty two & one fourth degrees west Six Perches to
a dead Standover. North thirty six & one half degrees
west Fifteen Perches to a Beech scrub - North thirty
& one half degrees west. Thirteen Perches - to a Chest Sapling
North forty one degrees west. Sixteen & one half Perches to Post
North seventy two degrees west. twenty & four tenths Perches to stem
North sixty three degrees west Six & one half Perches to a Post -
North ^{& one half} twenty two, degrees west Eight Perches to a Beech
South eighty three & one half degrees west - fourteen and one
half Perches to a Post. South seventy four degrees west
thirty six Perches to a Maple. Then North seventy three and
one fourth degrees west twenty six Perches to intersection
of New Washington and the reef on Cherry Run over. said
road passing through lands of the Widow Anderson -
& McCullough & Isaac Patchen - a Plot or Draft
of which we hereto annex

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of
Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the
11 day of January, A. D. 1883,
before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-
itants of the township of Burnside, in
said county, setting forth that they labor

under great inconvenience for want of a
public road to lead from the lane of James
Riddler in Burnside Township to or near
the borough line on the land of the widow
Anderson David McCullough and Horace
Palchur in the Township -

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same
according to law, make report to June term
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint
Thos H Moore John Cummings & Jos Breth Esq
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
