CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:~

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 10th day of January, A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Karthauss, in said county, setting forth that the Public road

laid out & opened leading from Schnuers Mill to Karthauss has in part become useless and inconvenient and they therefore pray the Court to appoint viewers to view and vacate all that part of the same, beginning at a point in the said road at or near Corner of Town plot and ending in the same at or near School House and to supply the same by a new road beginning at or near corner of Town Plot, the place where the petitioners desire the said road to be vacated & thence by the nearest & best route to a point at or near the School House in said Township of Karthauss to be opened & put in order by the Trustees of Karthauss School and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make Report to June 1st 1883

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Charles Schnuers F. F. Leondriet & E. J. Gilliland who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 14th Rule of Court.
