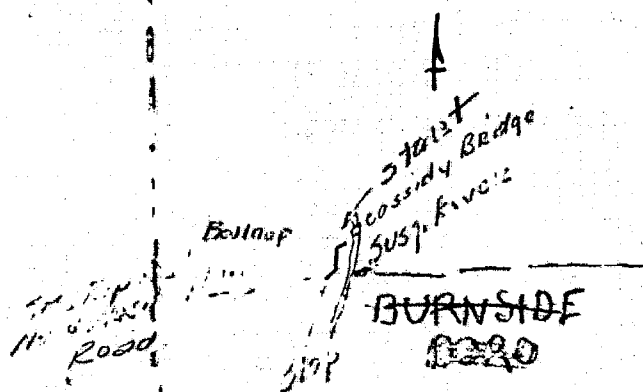

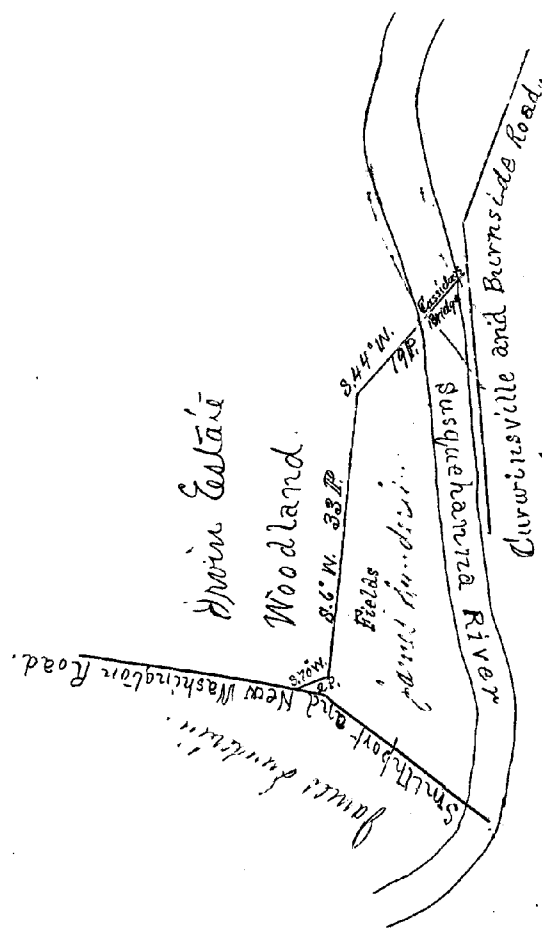

To the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the
Peace, in the annexed order named:

We, the subscribers, the persons appointed by the
said Court, to view and lay out the road therein
mentioned, report, that having been first duly
sworn & affirmed, in the manner and form
prescribed by the said order, that all of us having
viewed the ground for proposed road, and all
concurring, did lay out, and now return to
You for a public road, Beginning at a point
on the town's road leading from the "Wilmington"
to Smithport, at or near James Sunderlands, in
Rt. township, thence South seventy degrees West
(S. 70° W.) two perches (2 P.) to a post, thence by arable
lands of said James Sunderlands, South Sixty degrees
West, (S. 60° W.) thirty three perches, (33 P.) to a post,
thence by arable lands and across the Susquehanna
River, via James Cassidays Bridge, South forty four
degrees West, (S. 44° W.) nineteen perches (19 P.) to a
point on the public road leading from Courthouse
to R. M. wide, at or near R. S. Duffs, with reference
to the improvements through which it passes, a plat
in draft whereof is hereto annexed.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 20th day of Nov, A. D. 1884,

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a public road to lead from a point on the Top. Road leading from New Washington to Smithport at or near James Sunderlands in said Top, to a point on the road leading from Curwensville to Burnside at or near R. D.uffs

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, & Make Report at Feb. SS, 1885 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint W. J. Merguth Jacob McLaughlin & James Cowles who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as nearly as having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
