To the Honorable the Judges of the Court
of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

We the viewers appointed by the within
order of Court respectfully report:
That after giving due notice of the
time and place of said view
according to law we all met and
being duly sworn and affirmed
examined the said roads and ground
for proposed road and are of opinion; that
the short road from mouth of James
In^r Zaddens lane to or near S. Kauff-
man's Stable is not necessary for a
public road - that the road leading
from the mouth of lane between S.
Kauffman and R. Ellis is necessary
for public use and should be retained -
that the public road leading from
Wm Mahaffey's to the mouth of James
In^r Zaddens lane (the courses and distances
of which will be found below) is not nec-
essary and is burdensome to the people
and should be vacated.

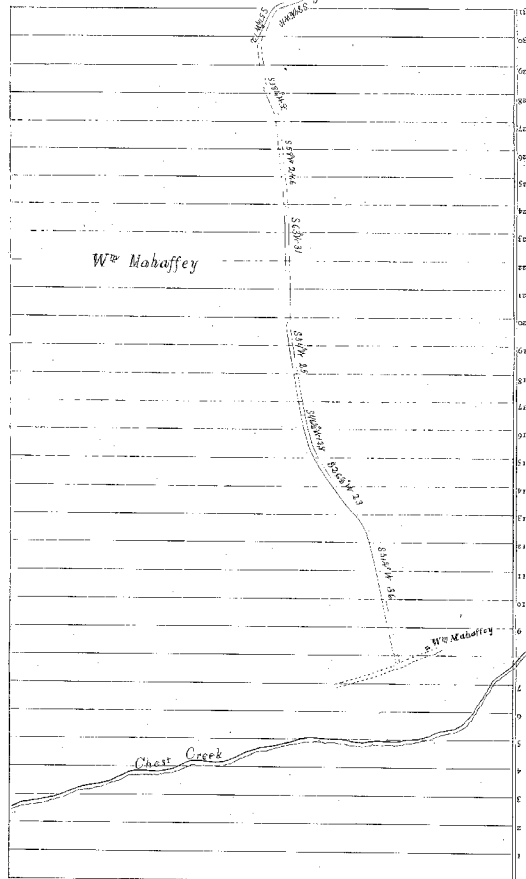
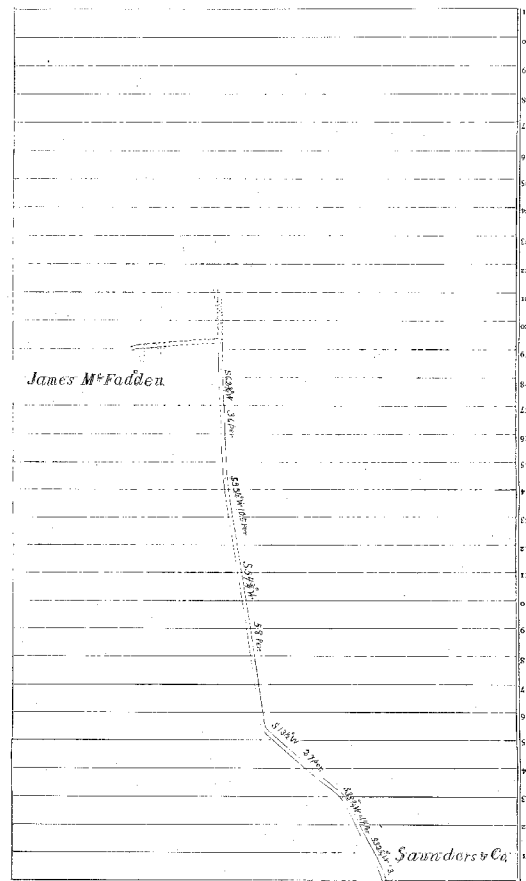

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:❖

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of
Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the
16th day of Jan, A. D. 1884,
before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-
itants of the township of Bell, in

said county, setting forth that the road leading
from Wm Mahaffey's to John Bells, the part from Wm Mahaffey
to the lane between James McFadden and Kuples should
be vacated, the other road leading from Mahaffey Mill to
John Bells from the Mouth of lane between S Kauffman and
R Ellis should be vacated and a short road supplied
from the road at the Mouth of James McFadden's lane to
the Public road at or near S Kauffman's stable

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same
according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint
Clinton Thompson, Robert Mahaffey and Willard Reed
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

N.B.—If the voters believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the bond, they will report to that effect.
