To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County:

The petition of the undersigned respectfully
represents:

That men appointed by this
Court, reported to the last term thereof that
they had laid out and returned for public
use the following road, viz:— a public road
to lead from Millstone Run where a
public road leading from the Susque-
hanna river to Clearfield crosses said
Millstone Run, to the end of the new
bridge over the Susquehanna at Shaws-
ville, said road being located in Brad-
ford Township, that said road is unnec-
essary for public use as laid out, that
said road as laid out will be very bur-
densome to the inhabitants of Brad-
ford Township, that there is a good road
which said road from the new bridge
over the Susquehanna can be made
to intersect at much less distance
than the now road as laid out, and
with much less expense, that the said
road as laid out is an unnecessa-
ry burden to the inhabitants of

Bradford Township.

Your petitioners therefore pray your
Honors to appoint proper persons to
review the said road and parts ad-
jacent and make report to the Court
according to law, and they will ever
pray, &c.

In Re Division of Dubois Borough into wards } Application Under Act of Assembly approved 16 Feby 1873, to designate officers to be elected at Feby election A.D. 1874

The Application of the Burgess and Clerk of the Borough of Dubois to designate the officers to be voted for at the ensuing borough election to be held on the 3rd Tuesday of February A.D. 1874, having been presented and duly considered, thereupon it is ordered that inasmuch as the said Borough has been divided into three wards that the number of members of the Council shall be increased from six to nine. That three members of Council shall be resident of each ward, and that at the ensuing election, that one member shall be elected from the 3rd Ward to serve for three years to take place of Geo. R. Vosburg whose time expires, also one member from the 3rd Ward to serve for the term of two years in place of John Horner whose term also expires, also one member from said 3rd Ward to serve for the term of one year, that there shall be elected one member from the 1st Ward to serve for three years in place of J. M. Wilson whose term expires, also one member to serve two years in place of M. E. Hay who returns, also one member to serve one year there shall also be elected from 2nd Ward one member to serve three years, also one member to serve two years, it being provided that one of the members

from the said 2nd Ward, shall resign in order to
~~effectuate~~ carry out the order,

That there shall be elected from each of said
Wards, one School director to serve three years,
and also one to serve two years, and one director
from the 3rd Ward to serve one year, retaining in
office those members of the board from the 1st
and 2nd Wards to serve one year from the ensuing
election to ~~the~~ whose term does not expire the
present school year.

That there shall also be elected One Overseer of
the Poor, One High Constable & Constable for the
Borough - one Jurge of election and two inspectors
one mapnty and one mononty inspection in
each of said wards. That public notice of the
order shall be given ~~also of this order~~ by
publishing the same for three weeks in two pa-
pers published in said Borough, in addition to the
notice of election required to be ~~by the~~ posted by
the Constable of said election.

In the matter of the division of the Borough of Dubois into wards.
And now October 2nd A.D. 1883. the Court confirms the judgment of the Grand Jury, and decrees that the subdivision of the Borough of Dubois into 3 Wards be made absolute, in conformity with the prayers of the petitioners, and that the First Ward all that part of said Borough bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the Mouth of Penty run on Sandy Lick Creek, thence up said Penty run its several courses and distances to where the South boundary line of said Borough crosses the same, thence South 68° W along the Borough line crosses the same along the line of said Borough to a Post at the School House, thence North 86° West by same two hundred and six perches to a Post, thence North 47° East two hundred and fifty three 6 perches to a Post at said Sandy Lick Creek, thence up said Sandy Lick Creek, thence its several courses & distances to the Mouth of the Shaffer ditch, thence up the Shaffer ditch to the Mouth of Penty run and place of beginning, and that the above described territory comprise and constitute the First Ward.
And the Court further decrees and fix the place of holding the election in said First Ward for the election of officers provided by law shall be at the Rumberger House, in said First Ward, on the 6th day of November A.D. 1883 between the hours of 7 o'clock A.M. & 7 o'clock P.M. of said day, & designate John H. Troppell to be the Judge of said election.
And Mike Simmons & W.A. Protheroe to be inspectors, & designate J. H. Johnson to give notice of the place & time of holding said election and the manner thereof.
And that the ^{Second} Ward as laid out by the following metes & bounds as follows: Beginning at Sandy Lick Creek thence by the Borough line South 45° West, (near one hundred & forty 4 perches to a Post, thence South 45° West two hundred & twenty seven 7 perches to a Post, thence by the same South 68° West to said Penty Run, thence down said Penty run its several courses and distances to said Sandy Lick Creek, thence up said Sandy Lick Creek its several courses & distances to the place of beginning.
