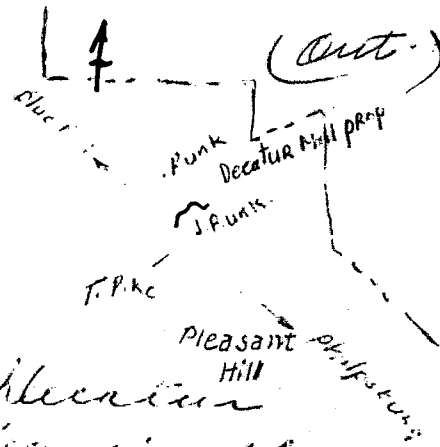

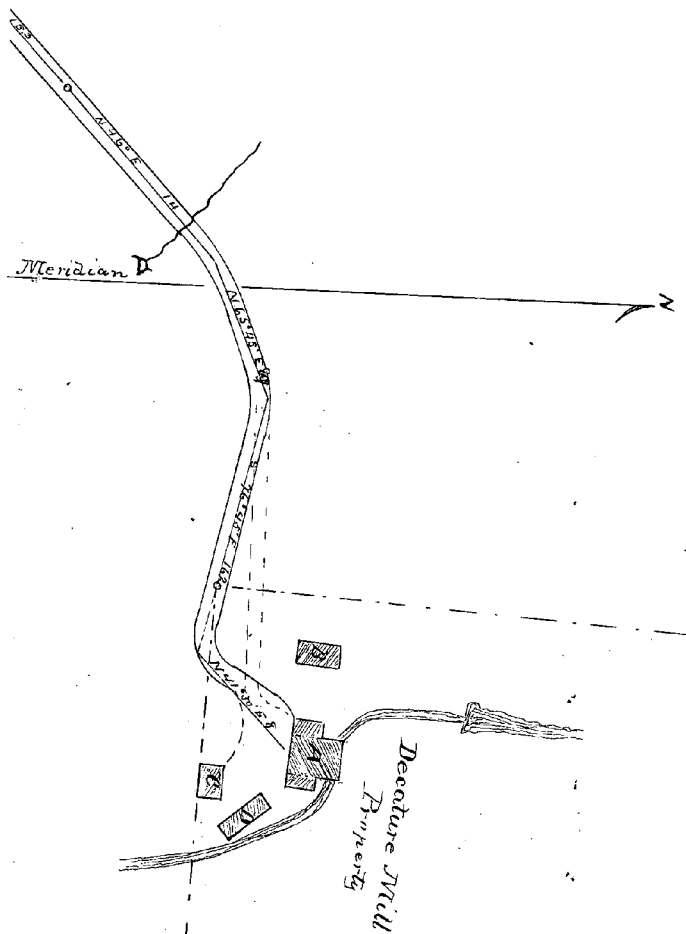

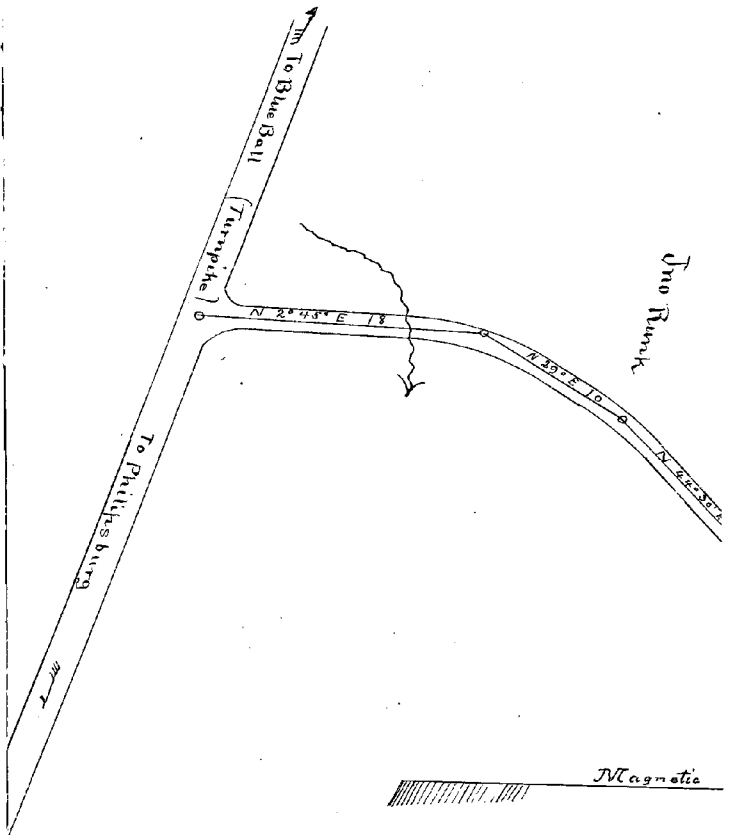

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out a public Road from the Swampike to Decatur Gristmill in Decatur Twp. Ala Co Pa. would respectfully report that after giving good & sufficient notice of the time and place of meeting did meet in pursuance of said notice and after all being severally sworn according to law went upon the premises and viewed the same and find that in our opinion a public Road between the points within named is necessary and we have laid out and do return for public use the following road to wit Beginning at a point in the Swampike at the intersection of a private road leading to said mill thence along said private Road N  $2\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  E. 18 per thence N  $29^{\circ}$  E. 10 per thence N  $44\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. 15.3 per thence S  $46^{\circ}$  E. 14 per thence N  $65\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  E. 8.9 per thence S  $76\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  E. 11.8 per to Corner of Decatur mill property (the whole of the aforesaid distance being on said private Road thence being laid through land of Jno Runk.) Thence S  $76\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  E. 4.4 per partly through land of Decatur mill property & partly through unimproved land of Jno Runk thence N  $41\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. 8 per to through unimproved land of Jno Runk & partly on said private Road to Decatur mill - a plot or dist of which is hereto annexed

 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 12th day of July, A. D. 1885, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Decatur, in said county, setting forth that the labor under

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint D. F. Charles Copelin John Reams and E. C. Read who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
