Sessions in & for the County of Clearfield.

The petition of Frances G. Snyder a citizen and tax-
payer in Lawrence Township said County respectfully
represents that a petition was presented to
said Court on May 28th, 1884 and entered of record to
Mo. 10 May Ser. 1884, praying the Court to appoint
proper persons to view and make a certain road
that had been laid out but not opened, in said
Township of Lawrence, leading from the East end
of the Goodfellow Bridge to a point in the public
road at or near Antler Run, all the proceedings
with reference to said road are set forth at length
in Road District Mo 2. to Mo. 2 March Ser. 1885,
and the Court did thereupon appoint as such
viewers Geo. C. Kirk, John A. L. Heger and Samuel
Hobson, that the order to view was enlarged on Sept.
23rd, 1884 until December Sessions 1884, that
said viewers failed to meet and make said view
within the time required by law, that the Counsel
for the petitioners in Mo 10 May Ser. 1884 was Mr.
D. F. Buckbank who in the early part of 1885 aban-
doned the practice of law in Clearfield County and
removed to Washington, D.C., that by reason of this
no further proceedings were had in said case
and that it remains of record undetermined
and undisposed of.

Your petitioner would therefore pray the Court that

that leave be granted to re-present the petition to said
Court on Mo 10 May Ser. 1884 for before having
venue appointed or substituted in place of venue to
be appointed so that the case may be proceeded with
and determined according to law.

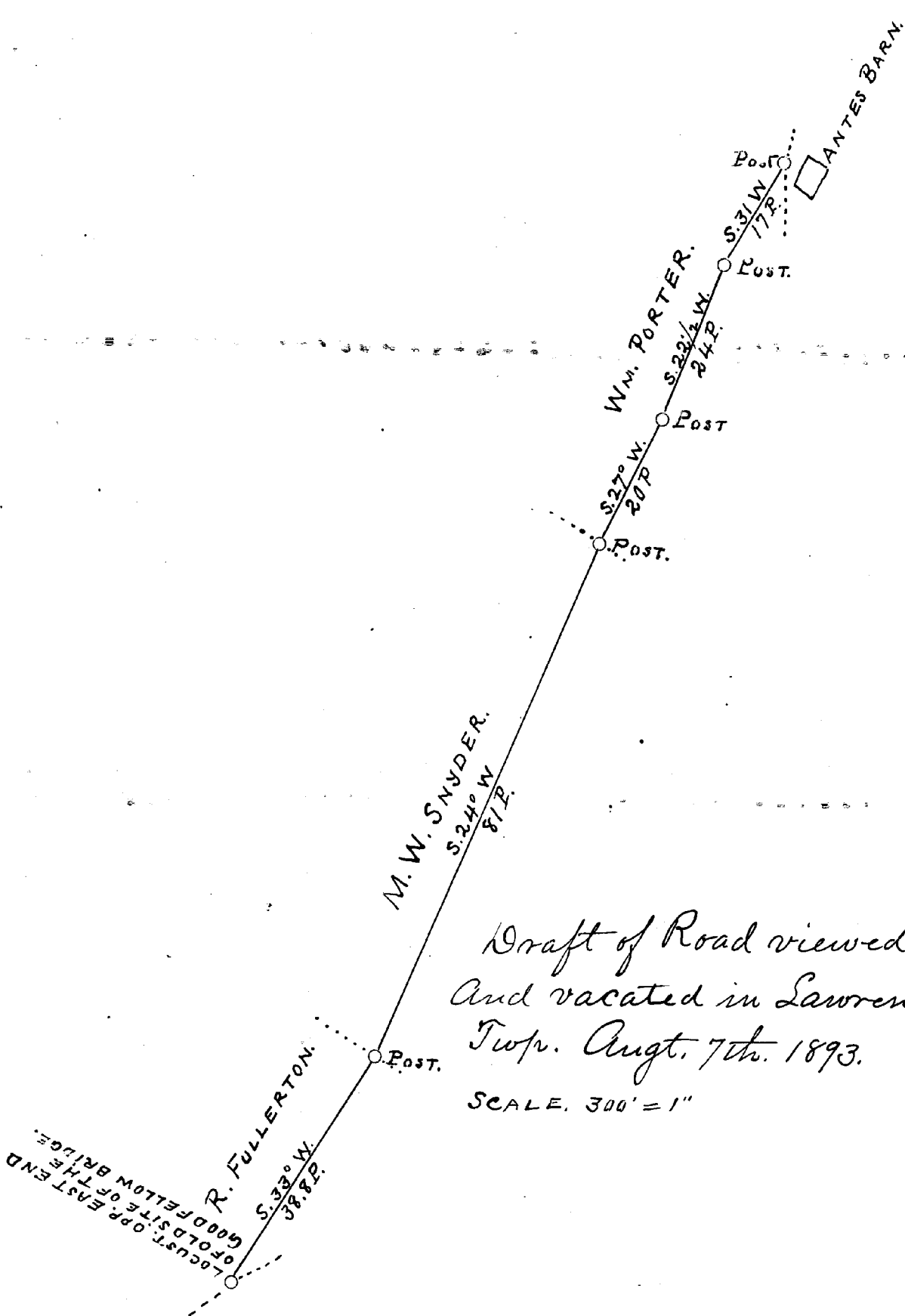

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17th day of May, A. D. 1893, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence

in said county, setting forth that
That a petition was presented to this Court as near as 28 1875 (to No) signed by your petitioners praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out a road from a point on or near Antlers Barn to intersect the Clearfield and Lawrence Turnpike or on near the Turnpike Bridge which was accordingly done and the Viewers so Appointed after being duly qualified according to law did lay out and return for public use a road beginning as a locus line opposite the East end of Goodfellow's Bridge thence S 85° 2' W through lands of R Fullerton 38.8 per to fence of M W Snyder thence through lands of M W Snyder S 24° 2' W 81 per to line of land of Wm Porter thence through said Porter's land S 27° 2' W 20 per S 22 1/2° 2' W 24 per S 31° 2' W 17 per to the old Township Road near Antlers Barn which road upon due consideration was approved and confirmed.
That the said road has not yet ~~been~~ been opened and it appearing to your petitioners to be useless & if opened would be burdensome. Your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint proper persons not residing on the route of said road to view the same and make report &c

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ~~view and lay out~~ ^{review} the same according to law, ^{and make report to the Court}
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo C Kirk Cyrus Howe and Harry Kerns who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to ~~view~~ ^{review} the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

 cepted in favor of the returner for said road.
 Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days em-
 ployed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
 Returners cannot interfere with damages assessed by the
 returners, but they may keep so far as the location may be chang-
 ed by the returners.
 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to
 damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well
 as the advantages of the road, they will report to the effect.
