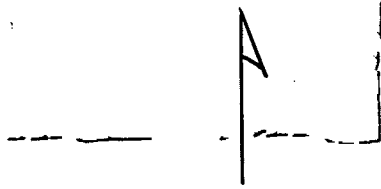

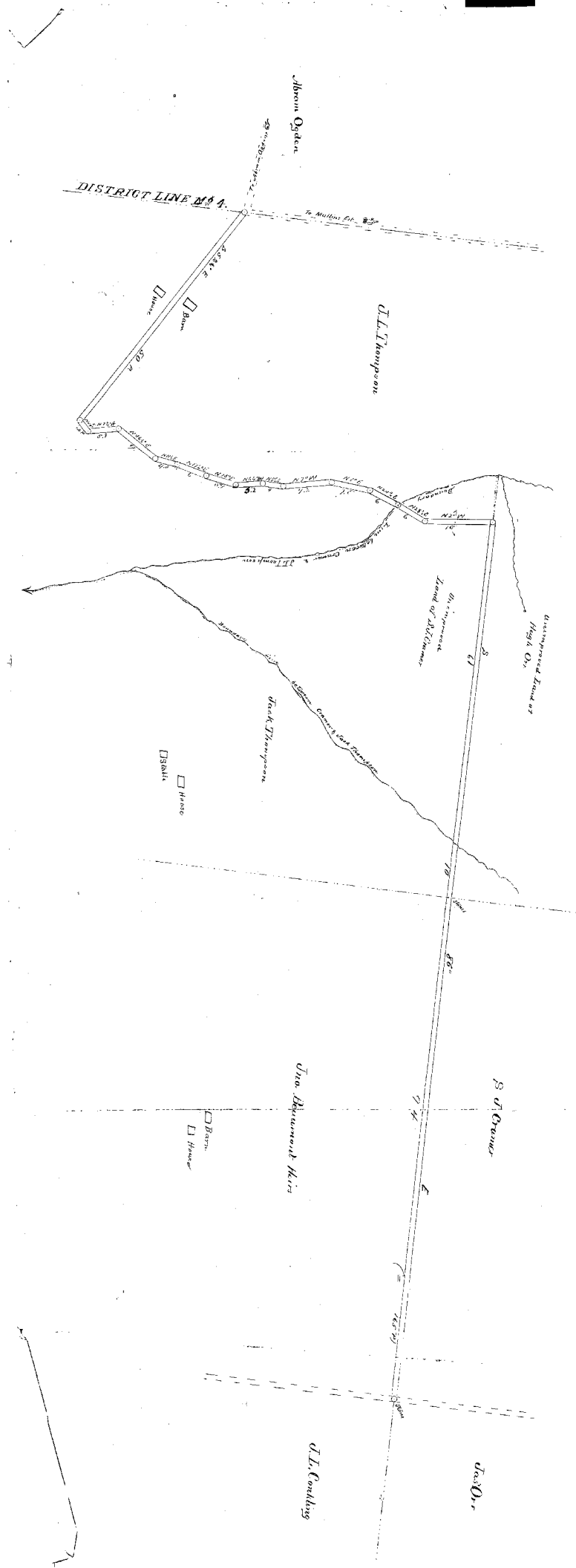

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 12th day of April, A. D. 1884, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bauman, in

said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a Public road
to lead from J. L. Thompsons in said Township to
a point on the main Road leading from Mont-
Gomery Brook to the Orr road at which the corner
of the several farmers of S. J. Kramer, W. M. J. Beau-
mont J. L. Leunklin and James Orr in
said Township

and, therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

E. B. Reed, M. Owens and J. Irvin McBride
 who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

We the subscribers appointed by the annexed Order of Court to view and lay out a Public Road therein mentioned, would respectfully report: That in pursuance of said order, after giving good and lawful notice by Posters (set up as follows to wit: one on west end of 2^d St Bridge in West Clearfield Boro, one at Mt Zion School House and one at the mill of H B Townsma (formerly J. P. Matheson) in Lawrence Twp.) we have viewed and laid out, and do return for public use as we find that a road ~~is~~ between the lands named in the annexed order is necessary. The bond must be duly sworn to by the number of days
employed and set the amount out of the foot of their return.
The bond must be returned to the court on or before the day
the return is made, and the return must be filed in the court
