

To the Honorable the Judges within named-

We the undersigned, persons appointed by the
within order of court, to view and lay out the road
therein mentioned, respectfully report—that
having been present at the view of the ground
proposed for such road, and having all first
been severally sworn or affirmed, in pursuance
of the said order we have viewed and laid out,
and do return for public use, the following road.
to Wit. Beginning at a post in lane near Barn of
Alexander Hoyt. Thence South twenty two degrees
East, four hundred and seventy feet to Charles
Shoemakers North line. Thence along said line East
twelve hundred and ninety feet to a chestnut
on lands of W^m. Beer. Thence North seventy degrees East
two hundred and three feet to a post on rear end
of proposed lot of German Reformed Church. Thence
along said church lot North eighty four degrees East
one hundred and sixty feet to a post in public
road leading to Sabula. Most of road being
wood land. A plot or draft whereof is hereto
annexed. Which said road, so as aforesaid laid
out, we are of opinion is necessary for a public road.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the

14th day of January, A. D. 1884,

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy, in

said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconveniences for want of a public road to lead from at or near the Barn of Alex Hoyt, and intersect public road running from Mr Shouakers to Tabula

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

J L Vosburg Samuel Brown & Geo Bowes

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the course and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

the original viewers, except so far as the location may be
changed by the reviewers.
N.B.—If the viewers believe the parties have not entitled
themselves to damages, taking into consideration the
value of the advantages of the road, they will report to
that effect.
