

## CLEARFIELD COUNTY, & SS:♦

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 16 day of January, A.D. 1884, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Grallauer, in said county, setting forth that B. D. Schonover et al represent that a road has been laid out from P.B. Mons lane to Kyles town and Grahamton road which your petitioners conceive is become inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint O. L. Dale, L. L. Kuebler and E. C. Read <sup>and locate</sup> who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Mons and after being severally sworn according to law, proceeded to view the grounds and find that the following described road is incorrect & Burdenous and therefore recommend that the same be vacated beginning at Post by White Pine stump near the Brick yard of P. B. Mons thence  $349^{\circ} 28'$  E 23 per thence  $885^{\circ} E$  32 perches to road leading from Rolling stone to Philipsburg. We proceeded then to supply the aforesaid road by beginning at Post by White Pine stump above mentioned thence through Land of P. B. Mons 34 $\frac{1}{2}$  perches and 25 $\frac{1}{2}$  perches through St. B. Records land to Post in aforesaid road leading from Rolling Stone to Philipsburg, and <sup>we</sup> hereby return the same for Pub- lic use and recommend that the same ~~will~~ be opened & made as it will be a great improvement on the old road both by making a better graded and also a straight Road. a draft of which is hereto attached.
