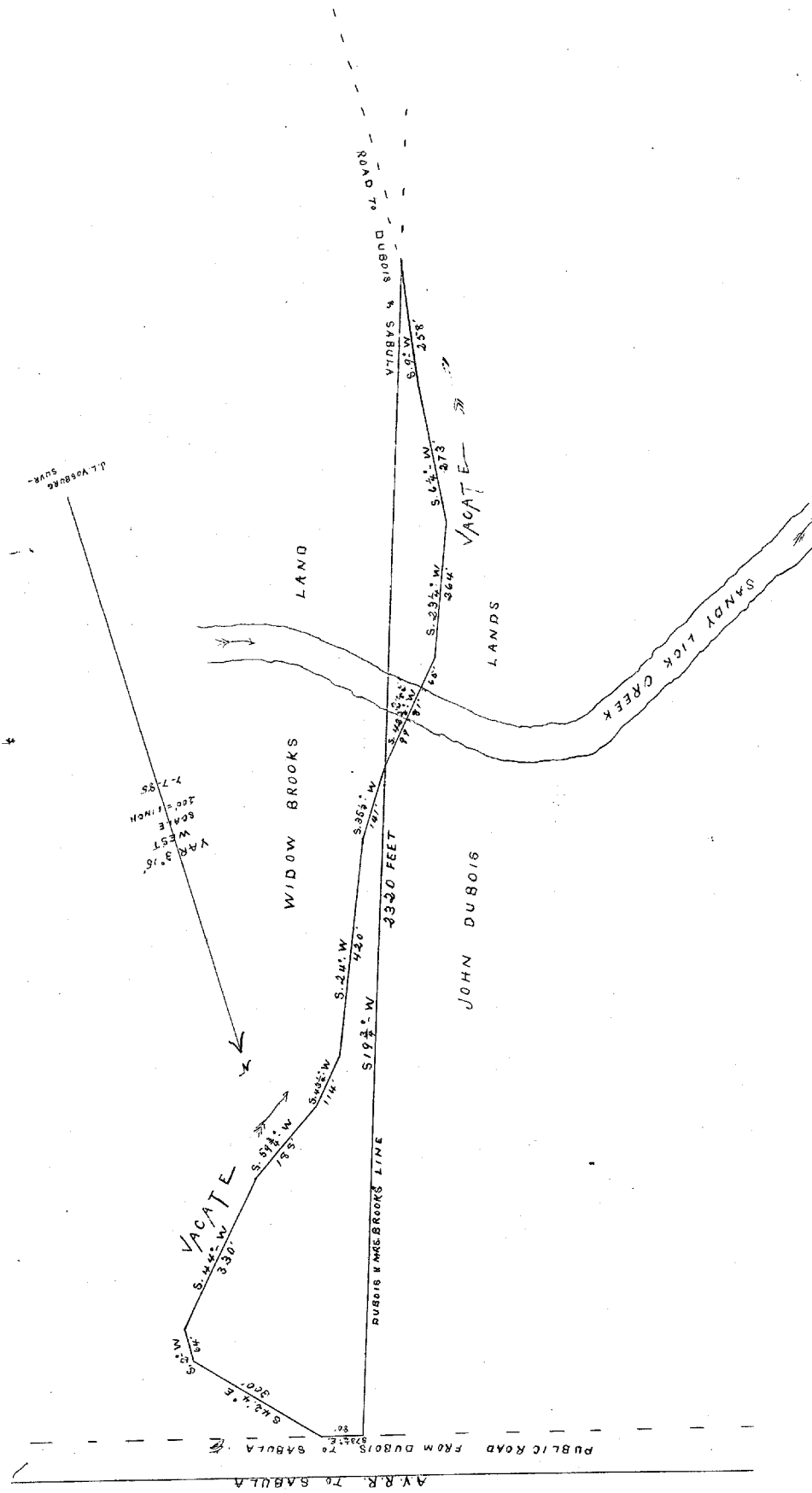

To The Honorable the Judges within named.  
We, the undersigned persons appointed  
by the within order of Court, to view vacate  
and supply the road thereina mentioned -  
respectfully report: That having been present  
at the view of the ground proposed for such  
road and all having been severally sworn  
or affirmed in pursuance of the said order  
We have viewed and laid out and do  
return for public use, the following road  
to wit: Beginning at a point where DuBois and  
Mrs. Brooks line intersects the public road  
leading from DuBois to Sabula. Thence along  
said line between John DuBois and Mrs. Brooks  
land - South nineteen and three fourths degree  
West. Twenty three hundred and twenty feet  
to a point where old road intersects said  
line between DuBois and Mrs. Brooks - Said  
view passing through wood land mostly.  
A plot or draft whereof is herewith annexed.  
Which said road, so as aforesaid laid out.  
We are of opinion is necessary for a public  
road. We also vacate the following piece  
of road which has been supplied by the above  
named road - To wit. Beginning at a  
point in public road leading from DuBois to  
Sabula and South Seventy Three and one fourth degree

East of place of Beginning of new road located.  
Eighty feet. Thence South Forty two and one fourth  
degrees East. Three hundred feet - Thence South  
Two degrees West. Sixty four feet - Thence South  
Forty four degree West. Three hundred and thirty feet  
Thence South fifty nine and three fourths degree  
West. one hundred and Eighty eight feet - Thence  
South Forty three and one fourth degrees West. one  
hundred and fourteen feet - Thence South Twenty  
four degree West. Four hundred and twenty feet.  
Thence South Thirty five and one fourth degrees West.  
one hundred and forty one feet. Thence South  
Forty two and three fourth degrees West. Two  
hundred and forty five feet. Thence South

# CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 29th day of May, A. D. 1885, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy, in said county, setting forth that a small portion

of the township road from near the Bridge across Sandy Creek to the public road leading up said bank from DuBois to Sabula, can be very greatly improved by a new location between those points above named by removing the present road to the line of land between John DuBois & Mrs Sarah Brooks

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ~~view~~ <sup>locate & supply said road</sup> and lay out the same as above described according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. L. Vosburg Lewis Zeigler & J. Heberling who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
