## CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May, A. D. 1885, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boyer, in

said county, setting forth that a road has been long since laid out from a point at or near the bridge at the foot of the hill on the Rolling Stone road to a point at or near the pine tree near the river banks, which your petitioners humbly conceive is now become useless, inconvenient and anathema to the inhabitants thereof and therefore ask the same to be vacated, and instead to supply a road from same point at foot of Rolling Stone hill near bridge to the fording in the bend to the point intersecting the road leading to Central point

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term.

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint E. C. Read, James Hughes & Joseph Potter who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

has become useless and unnecessary and we have therefore  
vacated the same as follows to wit Beginning at the above  
named point on said road thence along the same North  $10^{\circ} 06'$   
 $6.8' E.$  thence North  $30^{\circ} 06.11.2' E.$  thence  $N 35^{\circ} 06.25' E.$   
thence North  $28^{\circ} 06.28' E.$  to the Bank of the River  
a plot or Draft of which is hereto annexed. The land  
over which said road as laid out passes is owned by O.  
L. Schoonover and we believe he has or will not sustain any  
damage therefore witness our hands this 24<sup>th</sup> day of September  
of Sept Ad. 1885

employed and set the amount outat the foot of their return.  
Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by  
the original viewers, except so far as the location may be  
changed by the viewers.  
N.B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled  
to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as  
well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to  
that effect.




