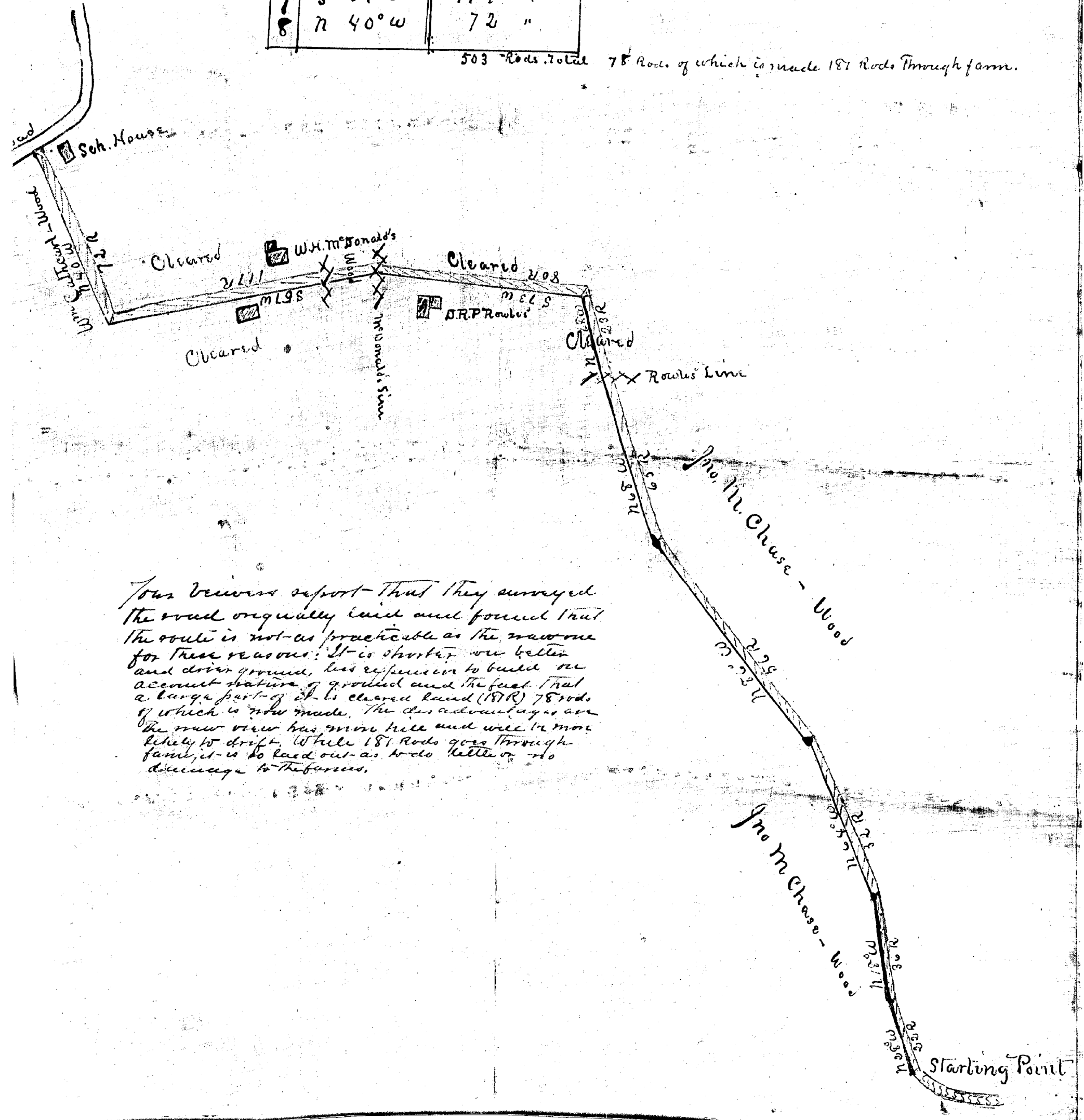

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:*

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of
Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the
26th day of Sept, A. D. 1885,

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-
itants of the township of Knox, in

said county, setting forth that a majority of the

original petitioners represent that a petition was presented
to the Court at SS. signed by four petitioners
praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view & lay
out a public road from Thos. Hamptons in Woodward
Tp. to a point at near Sarah Bowman's in Knox Tp. which
was accordingly done & said viewers appointed did view & lay out
the return for a public road, which was on due consideration con-
firmed by the Court, that the said part of said road in Knox Tp.
not yet being opened & part of the road in Knox Tp. being useless -
now pray for the Court to appoint to said road or part of said road from near
Westwood Island to near or at Sarah Bowman's & to locate & supply said road
to said road intersect the public road at or near Pleasant Ridge School House in Knox Tp.
and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same
according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Austin Chase, Rice Cowles, Jacob Hawley

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We, The persons appointed to view,
vacate and supply a public road in Knox
Township, as described in above order,
after giving due public notice of the day,
and having been severally sworn and affirmed,
do report as follows: That in pursuance of said
order, we did view that part of said road, des-
cribed in above order, not yet being built or paved,
and find that it would be, in our opinion,
useless, burdensome, and expensive; and we further
report that, in pursuance of said order, we
have viewed, laid out, and do return for public
use, the following road to wit: beginning at
that point on the new road leading from Thomas
Hamp Tins, crossing Cleopold Creek near Driftwood
Island, to a point on public road near Pleasant
Ridge School House, in Knox Township which
is now graded and completed, thence north
38 degrees west 22 rods; thence north 18 degrees
west 36 rods; thence north 64 degrees west 32
rods; thence ^{north} 86 degrees west 56 rods; thence
north 68 degrees west 65 ~~rods~~. To cleared and
unimproved land of D.R.P. Rowles; thence north 68 degrees
west 23 rods on cleared and unimproved land of
D.R.P. Rowles. Thence south 73 degrees west 80
rods through cleared and unimproved lands of D.R.P.
Rowles; thence south 57 degrees west through the
cleared and unimproved lands of W.H. McDonald. 78
rods of last course is already made road; thence north
40 degrees west 72 rods to point on public road near
Pleasant Ridge School House in Knox Township: A plot-
or draft whereof is herewith annexed.

 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
