

To The Honorable the Judges Within named  
We the undersigned persons appointed by the  
Within order of court, to view and lay out the  
Road therein named, respectfully report: that  
having been present at the view of the ground  
proposed for such road, and having all been  
first severally sworn or affirmed, in pursuance  
of the said order, we have viewed and laid  
out and do return for Private use, the following  
road, to wit. Beginning at a post in Township  
road leading from Dubois to Sabula and near  
Muddy run Bridge. Thence North Eight and one half  
degrees East. Three hundred and seventy two feet to a Hencock.  
Thence North Eleven degrees West, one hundred and twenty eight  
feet to a post thence North Thirty one and one half degrees West,  
one hundred and eighty seven feet to a pine. Thence  
North Twenty three and one half degrees West. Three hundred  
and sixteen feet to a Beech. Thence North along old tract  
line. Sixteen hundred feet, to a post and Ross McBracken  
corner. Thence North Thirteen degrees East. one thousand  
feet to a White oak near a Dixon house. Thence North  
Forty and three fourths degrees East. one thousand feet to a pine.  
Thence North Six and one half degrees East. Three hundred  
and sixty feet to a pine. <sup>the</sup> North fifteen degrees East. Two  
hundred and fifty feet to a pine. Thence North Ten degrees  
East. Three hundred and forty four feet crossing a ravine  
one hundred feet wide and thirty feet of a fill to a post  
on line of Jos. Merv. Thence North Eighty six degrees  
East. Five hundred and Thirty feet to Township road

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the

28<sup>th</sup> day of July, A. D. 1885,

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy, in

said county, setting forth that ~~gold road be~~

~~laid out commencing at or near the Muddy Run Bridge on the township road leading from the Borough of Du Bois to Sabula and leading near the residence of Joseph Wren on the township road leading from Sabula to Boones Mountain~~

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

I. S. Vosburg, Amos Kline & N. S. Hoover  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

the viewers can be expected to interfere with  
the petitioner's claim, and to charge him accordingly.  
N.B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled  
to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as  
well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to  
that effect.
