At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 8 day of January, A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Kar-Thaus, in said county, setting forth that They labor under

great inconvenience for want of a public road to lead from a point near the house of Frank Emenick on the road leading from Salt Lick to Three Runs, to a point at or near the Du Barry place on the road leading from Salt Lick to Butter Creek

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to March Term

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Charles Schriars, ^{Washington} Archibald Cole, ^{William} Moore James Cottonway who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

To the Honorable the Judges of The Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield.

We, the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order to view and lay out the road therein named, do report: That in pursuance thereof, after having given due public notice of the time and place of said view by advertisements as required by the Act of Assembly, and after having been duly sworn or affirmed, and having given due personal notice to the owners of the land through which said road passes, we viewed the ground proposed for the said road within mentioned and the undersigned, a majority of said viewers, do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners and that the same is necessary for a public road: And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable, agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit: Beginning at the DuBarry village on the road leading from Saltlick to Buttermilk, thence North ten (10) degrees West twelve rods. - thence North thirty four (34) degrees West sixteen (16) rods. - thence North fourteen (14) degrees West sixteen (16) rods. - thence North sixteen (16) degrees West twelve (12) rods. - thence North eleven (11) degrees West twenty (20) rods. - thence North eleven (11) degrees West twenty eight (28) rods. - thence North twenty two degrees West fifteen (15) rods. - thence West twelve rods. - thence North fifty one (51) degrees West six (6) rods. - thence North four (4) degrees West fifty (50) rods. - thence North 23 degrees West fifty (50) rods. - thence North twenty three degrees West thirty four (34) rods. - thence North thirteen (13) degrees West ten (10) rods and thence North two and one half degrees West fifty two (52) rods. - - A draft or plat of which said road is hereto attached, stating the courses and distances and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes.

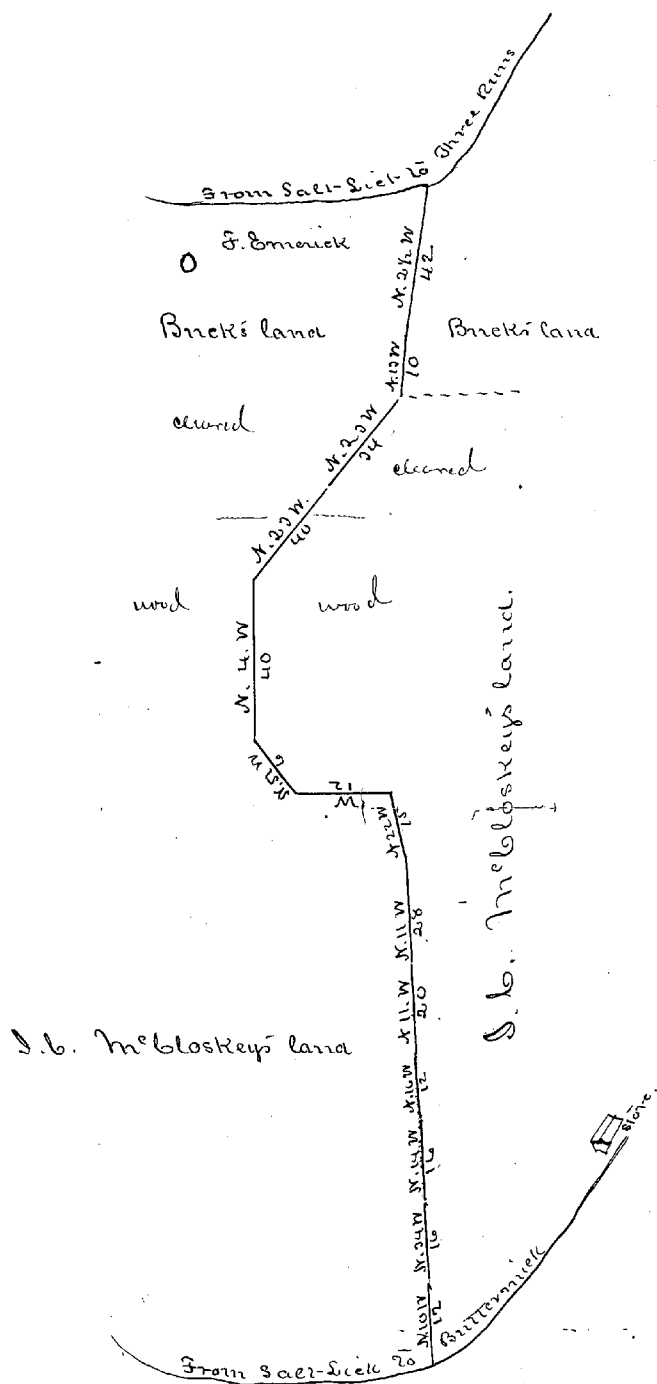
The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which
