who being duly sworn and acknow-
ledging to him very well is Supervisor
of Goshen Township, that he knows
that the proposed road from Mrs. L.
Shaw to Sick Run Bridge would accom-
modate but a few persons. That these
persons are Saml. Lansberry, Joseph
Lansberry and a Selfridge, That
Saml. Lansberry has a coal bank
which he desires to use this road for as
an outlet. That there is no public
necessity for said road. That in that
region there are great many roads and
more than are required, some of them
including the one in question being an
unnecessary burden to the township. That
there is a portion of said road which must
be expensive to build. That the township of
Goshen is already in debt to the amount of
about two thousand dollars and there is no
funds out of which to build said road and
further petitioner has run in his hands
an order to open a road from Robert Stems
creek place to ~~John~~ Nelson's place which does

land on or August 20th 1857 and that
road will cut me for from two thirds
and closer and the said township
is within limits which said road
unless a levy be made for that purpose
and further south west.

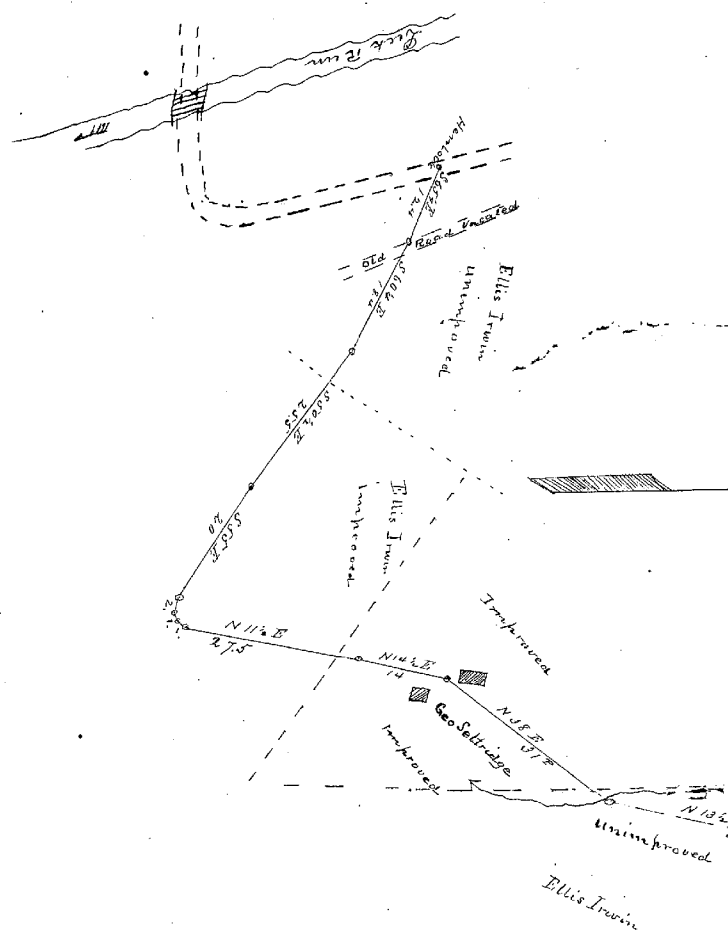

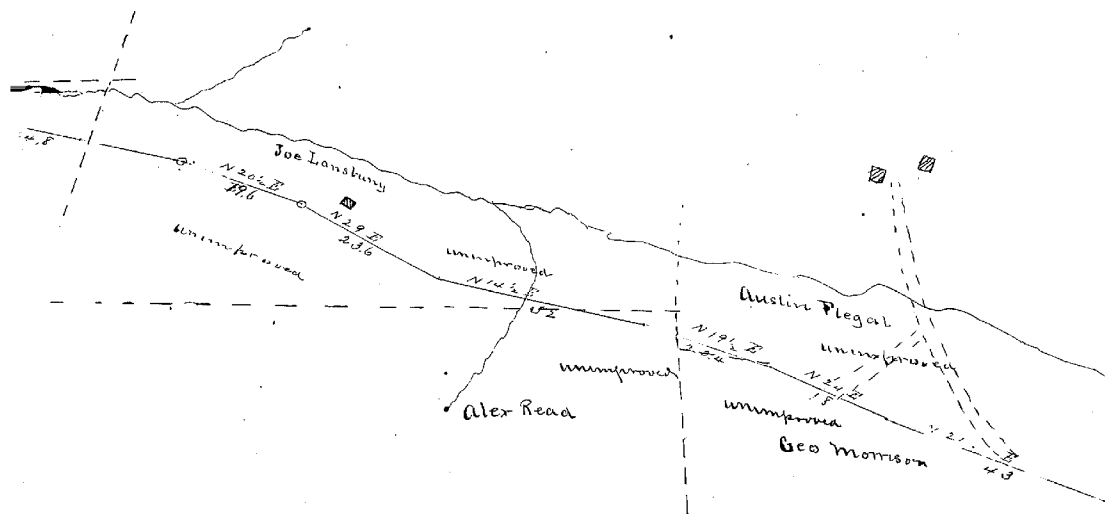

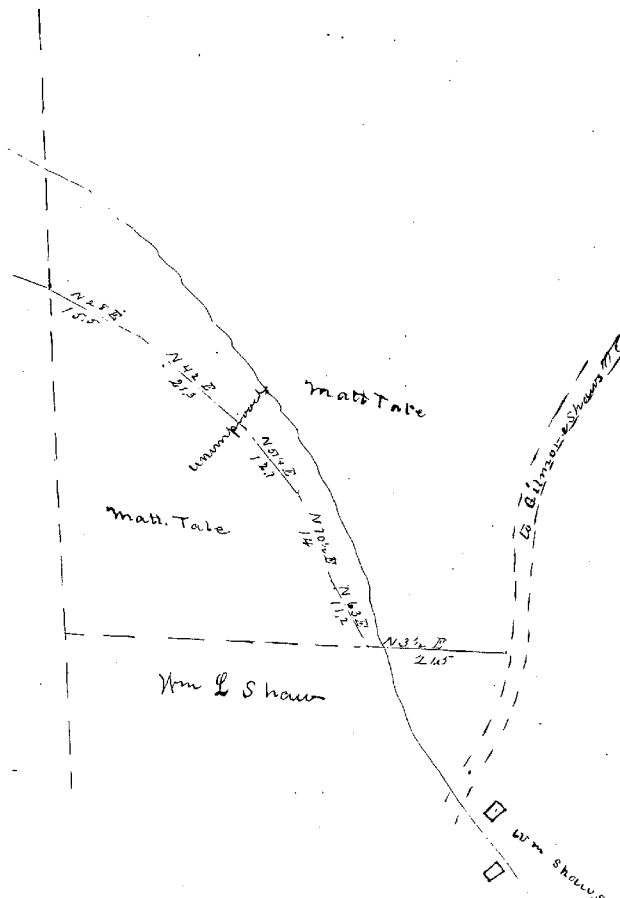

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28th day of Sept, A. D. 1883, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Goshen, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a public road to lead from a point near Lick Run Bridge on road leading from Morris Wallace to Goshen Church and ending near Wm Shaws in public road leading from Gilbert Shaws to Wm Shaws.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint E. C. Read Wm McCorkle and J. B. Shaw who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
