



To the Honorable Judges within named.

We the undersigned,

persons appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road herein mentioned respectfully report: That having been present at the view of the ground proposed for such road and having been first severally sworn, in pursuance of the said order, we have viewed and layed out and do return for public use the following road to wit: Beginning at a point in the Public road from Cov Run School House to the Mouth of Morgan Run and about 200 yds from said School House, thence South Thirty-seven degrees East, Seven Hundred and Fifty Feet, thence South Forty-nine and one-half degrees East, Seven Hundred and Sixty Feet, thence South Thirty degrees East Three Hundred and Ninety Feet, thence South Three and one-half degrees West, Three Hundred and twenty Feet; thence South Twenty degrees East, Five Hundred Feet; thence South Forty-two degrees East, One Hundred and Sixty-four Feet; thence South Twenty-six degrees East, Four Hundred Feet; thence South Eight degrees East, Two Hundred and Thirty-five Feet, thence South Thirty-four degrees East, Two Hundred Feet, thence South Fifty-three and one-half degrees East, Two Hundred and Four Feet, thence South Twenty and one-half degrees East,

One Hundred and Ninety-four Feet; thence South Fifty-seven degrees East, Five Hundred and Twenty-four Feet; thence South Eight degrees East Two Hundred and Twenty-four Feet; thence South Seventeen degrees East Nine Hundred and Seventy Feet; thence South Seven and one half degrees West, Three Hundred and Fifty Feet to the Public Road running along Cleared Corn and about 400 feet north of the Mouth of Lost Run. Of the above road, Four Thousand Five Hundred and Sixty Feet (4560) will be in Knox Township and Seventeen Hundred and Seventy Feet in Bigler Township.

The lands through which the proposed road passes are unimproved and we are of the opinion that there should be no damages assessed. They are the property of Mess. Geo. W. Bristow and Chas. R. Scott and Mrs. Swope, a part of said road being herunto attached.

Which said road, so as aforesaid laid out we are of the opinion is necessary for a public road.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 16th day of Sept., A. D. 1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the townships of Knob & Bigler, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Wm. Luther Wulcox and Harvey Myers who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
