" To the Hon, the judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County;

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13 day of Dec, A. D. 1886, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs & Morris, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconveniencce for want of a public Road or highway in the township of Boggs & Morris aforesaid to begin at a point in Boggs Lp in the public road leading from Wallacetown to Rykertown on the premises of John Rothrock at or near where a road now or here before used connected with said public road & extending thence to a point in Morris Township in public road leading from Wallacetown to Mondale on the premises of Wm. Dick at or near where said way now or heretofore in use connected with said last mentioned public Road

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, & make report thereof

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint C. Read, S. A. Caldwell & Patrick Lourley

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

sufficient notice of the time & place of meeting
for said view, we met in pursuance of said notice
& all being present & all being first severally sworn
& affirmed according to law. We viewed the premises
and are of the opinion that a public Road between
the points within named is ~~not~~ necessary
and we have laid out & do return for publication
the following Road to wit: - Beginning at a point on the
Road leading to Morrisville ^{at Morrisville} thence through un-
improved land of Hm Quirk A 37 $\frac{1}{2}$ N 23. Rods to the
line between land of Hm Quirk & Jas McAvish being also the
line between Morris & Doggs Swept, then continuing said

Lwp. the additional distance of 16.8 Rods to a point in
the old road formerly used to have lumber from W. G. Gullif.
