- 1 The viewers on the above road failed to assess
any damages to the owners of the land through
which said road was viewed

damages from the owners of the land through which
said road was viewed as directed by law.
- 4 Said road as viewed runs parallel, and at no
point is over 60 rods from a road which
has been in public use for over 30 years and
intersects the "hie road" from Dubois to Goodlanders
farm about 50 rods north of the proposed new
road and the lower or bottom road a few rods
from where the proposed new road intersects
said bottom road which leads from Dubois to Erie
Rake near Goodlander farm

to the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County
The petition of the undersigned citizens of
Perry Township in said County re-
spectfully represent that they labor un-
der a great inconvenience for want
of a public road leading from
the public road at or near J.C. Rockey's

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, & SS: *

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 10th day of February, A. D. 1886, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from the public road at or near J. C. Rockey's Mill in said Township to the public road leading from Dusoir to the old Goodlander farm at or near the Sandy and Brady Township line

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~and make report to the Court~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

David Reavis Andrew Smith & Andrew Liddle who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
