Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 18th day of Dec, A. D. 1886, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the townships of Beccaria & Jordan, in said county, setting forth that the public road beginning at a point at or near the house of Wm Lightner and Station of Clearfield & Cresson R.R. in Beccaria Tp. and ending at the Klew Hofs Road at a point or near John Swan's Camp in Jordan Tp., in its present location has been inconvenient, burdensome and that your petitioners labor under inconvenience for want of a new road in certain places between said points. Vacate the public road now open between said points

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. W. Moore Fred Shoff Robt M Johnson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

appointed by the foregoing order of Court to
View the road therein described Do Report -
That in pursuance of said appointment and
after first having given due notice of the time & place
of meeting, and notice also having been
given to owners and occupants of lands through
which said road was intended to pass of the
same, we all met and being duly sworn
and affirmed according to law, proceeded to
view said proposed route for said road
and we have laid out and do Return for
Public use the following. Beginning at a
Point on the Cresson and Clearfield Rail Road
near William Lightners. Thence on line of Dorsey
Avenue North twenty eight degrees & forty five minutes
East, Fifteen hundred & seventy feet to the centre of Rose
street in the town of Irona. Thence along Rose St
South sixty one degrees and fifteen minutes East Three
hundred and ninety six feet to the centre of Frank
street - Thence along Frank Street North twenty eight
degrees and forty five minutes East, Three Hundred
feet to Emma Street. Thence by same North
sixty one degrees and fifteen minutes west - fifty
feet. Thence North, twenty eight degrees & forty five
minutes East, One Hundred & sixty six feet to a Post

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a Plot, or Draft of which we herewith annex
and we hereby vacate all such portions of
the road now in use between the Cresson
+ Cleunfild Rail Road and the Glen Hope Turnpike
which the within or aforementioned road is intended

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

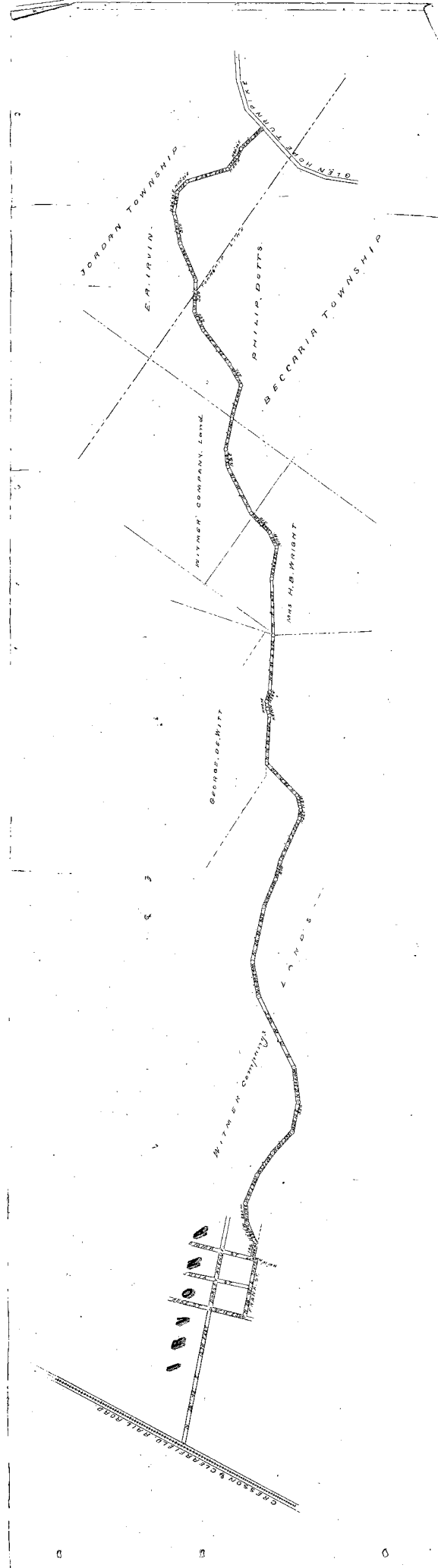

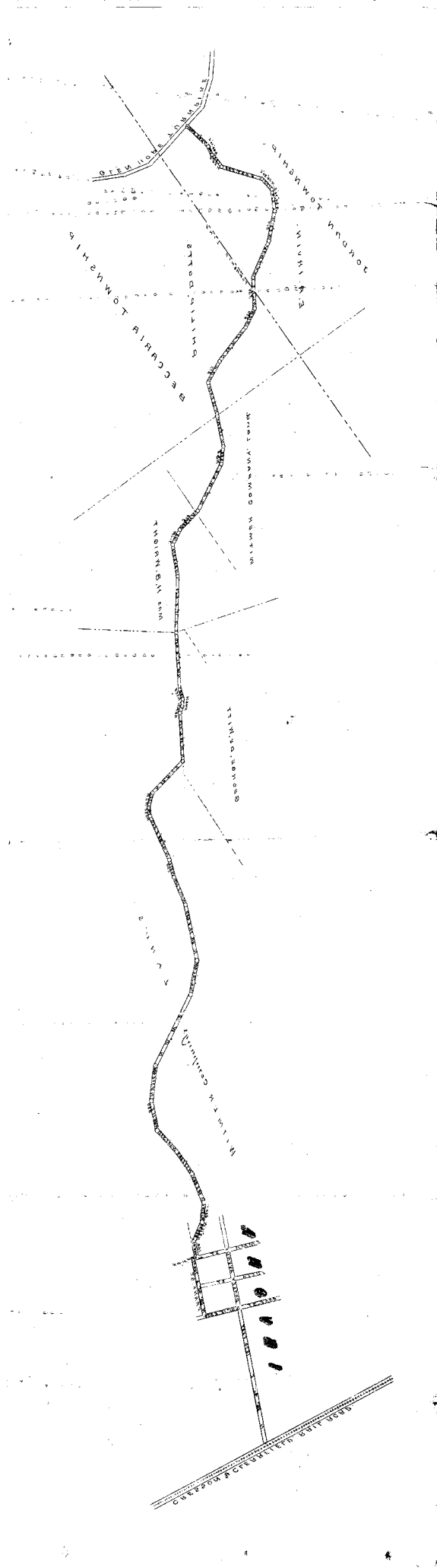
