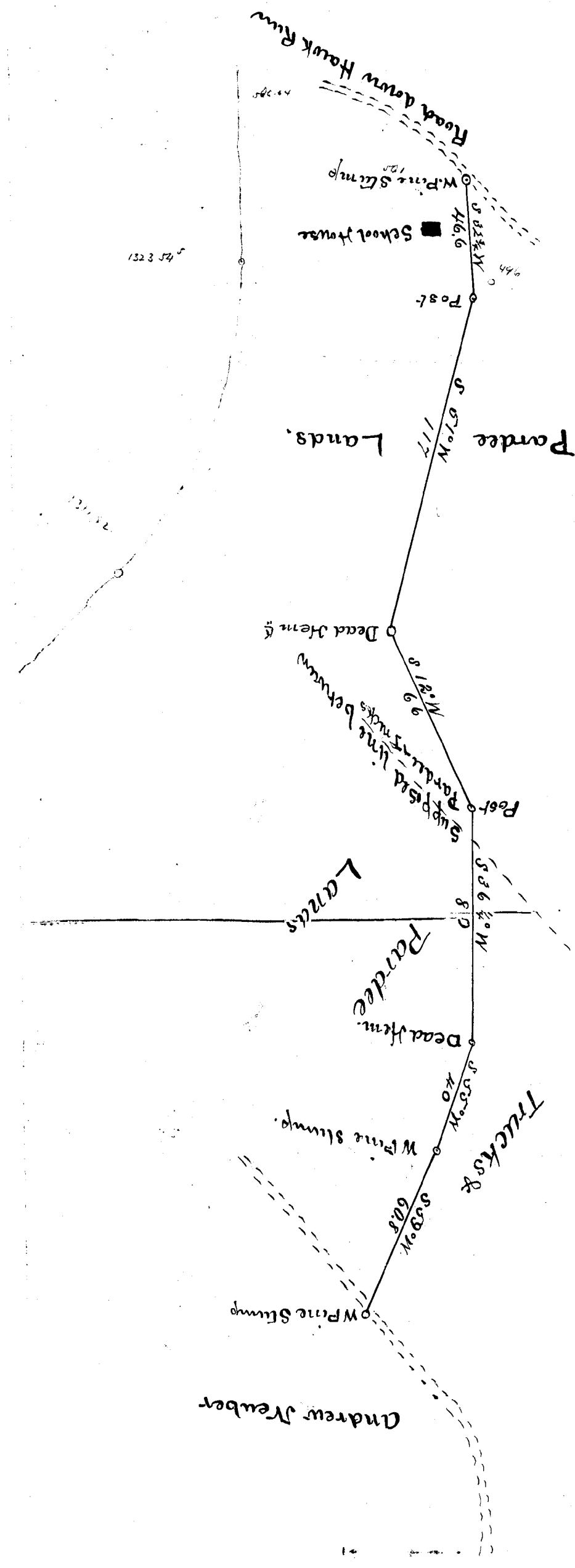

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NOTE.—In case of a Private Road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also.—Viewers will generally take the number of days employed and set the amount on the foot of their return. Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the review. If the parties are not entitled to damages, but the view is a contribution, the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

We the subscribers ~~would respectfully report~~
appointed by the within order of Court to view the road
therein mentioned would respectfully report; - That in
obedience of said order and after giving good and
sufficient notice of the time and place of meeting for said
view, we all met and after all being first severally sworn
according to law we have viewed the premises in said order
mentioned and find that a public road between the points
therein named is necessary and we have laid out and do
now return for public use the following road to wit;
Beginning at a marked pine stump on the line between the farm
of Andrew Neubaur and unimproved lands of the Trunks
thence through said lands of the Trunks thence South
59° West 60.8 Rods to a Pine stump thence South 55° West 40
Rods to a dead Hemlock thence South 36° 4' N. 80 Rods to
a Post on unimproved lands of Pardue thence South 12° N.
66 Rods to a Hemlock (dead) thence South 57° West 117 Rods
to a post thence South 32° 3/4' N. 46.6 Rods to a Pine Stump
at the side of Public Road leading from Pardue Mines to
Philip's Burg. being a total distance of one and two hundred & eighty
five one thousandth miles ($1 \frac{285}{1000}$ miles) a plot of which
is hereto annexed We are further of the opinion that no
claim here will be sustained by any owner of lands over which
said road above mentioned has been laid out

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of
Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the
22 day of Sept, A. D. 1886,
before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhab-
itants of the township of Morris, in
said county, setting forth that *Of our free*

*labor under great inconvenience for want of a
public road or highway to lead from a point
on Public Road at or near the end of A Hubert
lane to a point at the end of a public road at
School House near the Paidee Mines in*

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same
according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint
E. L. Read, Geo. D. Hess, and James Thompson
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they
view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road,
they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do
least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary
for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and
distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure
releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to
procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall
state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be
given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended
to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
