To the Honorable the judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions
of Clearfield County:

The petition of the undersigned, citizens of the Borough of
Newburg, in said County respectfully represents:

That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public
road, to begin at a point on Wilson Run, where the public road
leading from said run, and from Newburg, to Ferguson Township,
crosses said run in said Borough, thence by a direction nearly due
East, across the Clearfield and Jefferson County Railroad, to a
point on the ~~said public road~~, about five rods East of said Rail-
road. Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint qual-
ified persons, according to law, to view the ground proposed for
said road, and if they should see occasion to lay out the same, to
inquire of and vacate that part of the public road now open from
the starting point of the proposed road, to where the same would
be intersected by the proposed new road; which public road, now
opened, will, by reason of the laying out of the proposed road be-
come useless; and make report of the proceedings to the next Court:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the

17th day of May, A.D. 1886

before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of borough of Newburg, in

said county, setting forth that they labor under great

inconvenience for want of a public road leading to begin at a point on Wilson Run - where the public road leading from said run from Newburg to Ferguson Rds crosses said run in said Boro. then by a direction nearly due east across the Clearfield and Jefferson County railroad to a point on this said public road about five rods east of said Railroad in said Boro - your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint qualified persons according to law to view the ground proposed & if they see occasion to lay out the same to inquire of and Vacate the part of the Public road now open from the starting point. & where the same would be intersected by the proposed New road

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, & make report thereof according to law -

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

W. S. Mahaffey, John M. Riddle & M. W. Moore

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


We the undersigned Viewers appointed
by the foregoing Order of Court to View
the road therein described. Do Report—
that in pursuance of said appointment—af-
ter having first given due notice by written
and printed advertisements of the time
and place of meeting and also having
given notice to owners and occupants of
land through which said road was intended
^{and being duly affirmed} to pass of the same, we all met—, and
having viewed said proposed route we
are of the opinion that the prayer of said
Petitioners should be granted. we have there-
fore viewed laid out and do return for
Public use the following road—viz—

Beginning at a point in the centre of street
leading east from the Borough of Newburg and
about twenty five feet west of the Bridge across
Wilson's Run. Thence North Sixty three degrees
and thirty minutes East. Three hundred & Ninety
five (395) feet across the Clearfield & Jefferson
Rail Road, Thence South fifty two degrees and
thirty minutes East. three hundred and seventy
five (375) feet to a point on Public road leading
from Newburg Borough to Ferguson township

And we hereby vacate all that part of said
Public road now in use, between the Points
hereinbefore described. Beginning at the
Point: twenty five feet west of Wilsons Run Bridge
thence North eighty three degrees West Six Hun-
dred ten (610) feet. Thence South forty four
degrees East: One Hundred and forty (140) feet
to a Post: a Plot or Draft of which we here-
unto annex. and having enquired as to
the damage resulting to any one by reason of
the laying out said road, have ascertained that
no damage results to any one

Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers, to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
