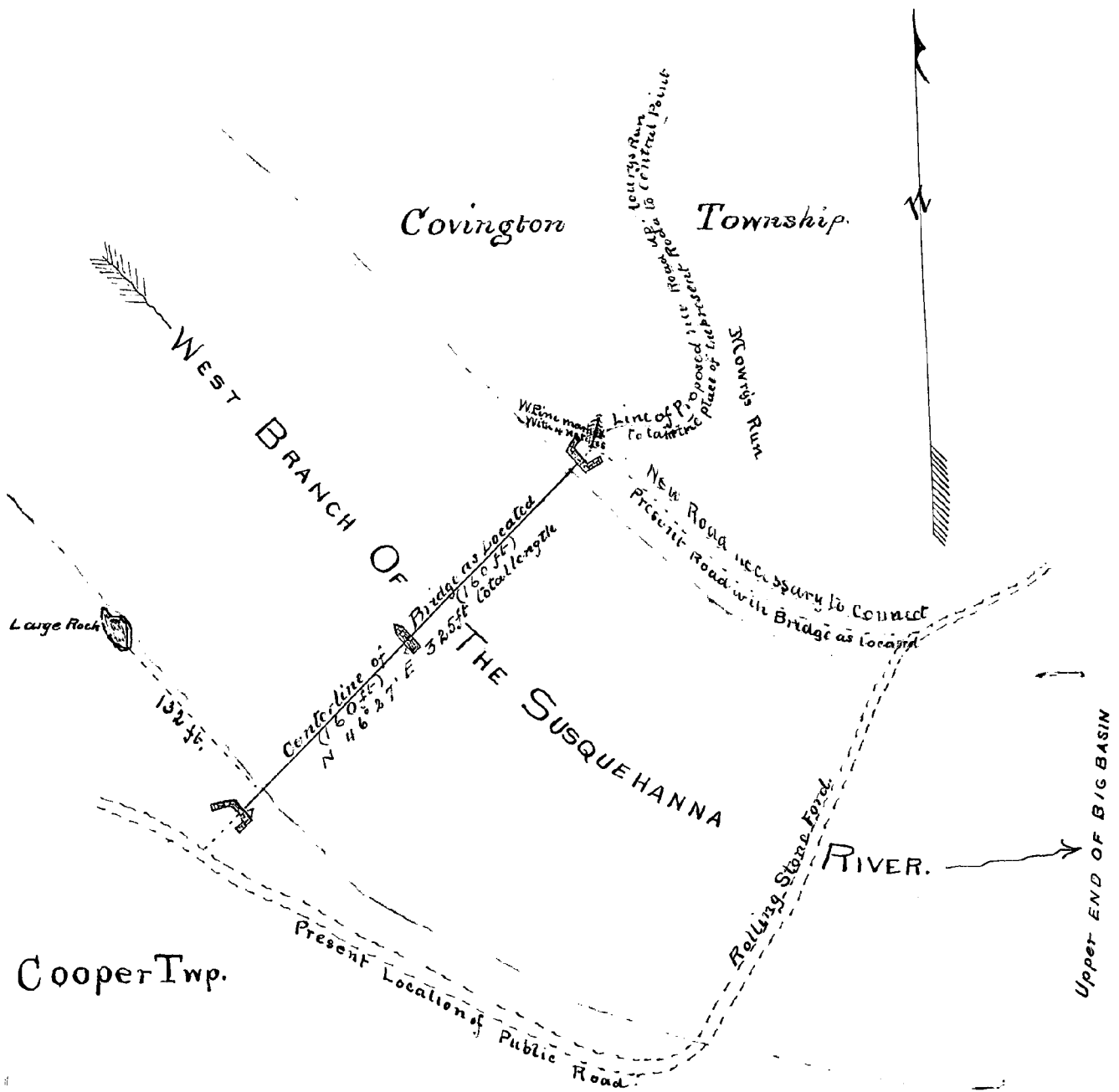

sioners of the County find that the funds of the
County will warrant the Expenditure to Build
a suitable Iron Structure, they may appropriate
Money for the Building of the same.



To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Pa.

We the subscribers, persons appointed by the Court to view the place proposed for the Bridge in the within order mentioned, respectfully report: That having all been present together, at the place proposed for the bridge within named, and having all ^{being} first severally affirmed according to law in pursuance of said order, we have viewed the premises aforesaid, and are of the opinion that a Bridge over the west branch of the Susquehanna River at or near the place where the public highway leading from Central Point in Cornington Township to Rylertown in Cooper Township crosses said river is necessary, and that the erection of such a bridge would be attended with more expense than it is reasonable the said townships of Cooper & Cornington should bear, we are further of the opinion that a Bridge of 2 spans, of one hundred and sixty feet in length each at an elevation of not less than 20 feet above low water mark, would be the proper kind of Bridge to erect. And we also further report to the Court: That after proper examination, we are of the opinion that a change in the bed and route of the road would be an improvement and a saving of expense in the erection of the aforesaid bridge as well as adding largely to the safety of the same after its erection, and therefore report: That the route of said road should be changed in the following manner to wit: Beginning on said road at the approach to the Rolling

Stone Fording in Coorington Twp. thence up along the said
river about 300 feet to the point located for said bridge
a plot or Draft of which is hereto annexed.
